The unique thing about this memorial service was that Corrie and Pam (her personal assistant) had it all planned and on paper a long time before Corrie died. Many of the big churches in Southern California were vying to hold the memorial at their church. The most insistent one was the Crystal Cathedral. Their church policy did not allow for women in the pulpit, but any time they could get Corrie to speak there, they had her and made a very big fuss about her.

Soooo ... Pam and Corrie contacted the Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana for the burial and were promised their Episcopal Chapel for the service. Attendance was by invitation only and that packed the chapel to capacity. It was a bittersweet occasion. Most of us near to Corrie had been praying for years for God to release her from the silent body and take her to Glory, but when it happened, I personally fell apart. What would the world be like for me without my precious Tante Corrie? My husband Len supported me well and reasoned with me, and at the service my longtime friend, Cliff Barrows, was at my side to lend a shoulder and speak a word that calmed me down.

I love to think of her now and all the reunions with Opa and Betsie and all the others and to think of her with Mother Teresa and the saints she knew about but did not meet on earth. Once when our visit was cut short and I was complaining a bit that I did not get to finish visiting with her, she smiled at me. "Marti," she said, "we will have all eternity to visit. I think that will be enough." So I am looking forward to that visit. For sure.


# Miss ten Boom, author, survivor of Nazis, dies

PLACENTIA, Calif. (UPI) — Author Corrie ten Boom, who was sent to a Nazi concentration camp for protecting Jews in the occupied Netherlands and survived to become a best-selling Christian writer, died Friday on her 91st birthday.

Ten Boom wrote 18 books that sold over 7 million copies, including the autobiographical "The Hiding Place," which was made into a 1975 movie starring Julie Harris.

Ten Boom, who had been ill since 1978 when she suffered the first of a series of strokes, died at her home, a family spokesman said yesterday.

Ten Boom spent the first 50 years of her life as a watchmaker in her father's shop in Haarlem, the Netherlands.

CORRIE TEN BOOM was a child of the gay nineties. But there was a period right after she reached the half century mark when there was no gaiety in her life — not by a long shot. That was the time of her arrest in her native Haarlem, Holland and her subsequent imprisonment at Ravensbruck extermination camp in Germany.

There during World War II, smoke poured forth from the crematory; a total of 96,000 womens lives were taken. Miraculously, through a clerks error, Corrie was released — not hurled into a furnace.

A dutch Christian, Corrie's "Crime" had been the leading of a resistance force primarily engaged in hiding Jews and otherwise assisting them in their efforts to escape Nazi persecution.

Central to everything is Corrie's deep faith in God and thus following her release from prison on Dec. 28, 1944, Corrie began devoting her full time to a two-way ministry; Lecturing and writing (she is the author of 11 books including "THE HIDING PLACE").

Corrie never believed her release was a clerks error! She was spared she will tell you, to speed the great truths she and her sister Betsy had learned. "That there is no pit so deep and no darkness so black that the love of Jesus Christ and His power cannot triumph over it".

Corrie was born in 1892 and at Eighty Three she has crisscrossed the globe many times in her enthusiastic mission to tell as many people as possible about her faith in God, His power to lift us above our circumstances and to give us a truly abundant life.
