

Howard Thurman: A Brief Chronology

1899	Born in Florida on 19 November, raised in Daytona
1915–1919	Attends Florida Baptist Academy/Florida Normal and Industrial School in Jacksonville/St. Augustine
1919–1923	Attends Morehouse College, Atlanta Georgia
1923–1926	Attends Rochester Theological Seminary (Rochester, NY)
1926	Marries Katie Kelley; Minister of Mount Zion Baptist Church, Oberlin, OH
1927	Daughter Olive is born
1928	Professor of religion, Morehouse and Spelman Colleges
1930	Katie Kelley dies
1932	Marries Sue Bailey; campus minister and professor of religion, Howard University
1935–36	Chair of Negro Delegation on “Pilgrimage of Friendship” to South Asia
1944	Becomes co-pastor of Fellowship Church in San Francisco, pioneering interracial church
1949	Publishes <i>Jesus and the Disinherited</i>
1953	Becomes dean of chapel and professor of spiritual resources and disciplines at Boston University
1963	Travels to Africa, teaches at Ibadan University in Nigeria
1965	Retires from Boston University, returns to San Francisco, directs activity of Howard Thurman Education Trust
1971	Publishes <i>The Search for Common Ground</i>
1979	Publishes <i>With Head and Heart: The Autobiography of Howard Thurman</i>
1981	Dies on April 10
