



COVID-19 Pandemic ...A Brief Narrative



1. What is COVID 19: Coronavirus (COVID-19) is also known as SARS-CoV-2, 2019 Novel Coronavirus, nCov COVID-19 is an illness that can affects lungs and airways. The strains of the coronavirus have caused outbreaks such as severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) and middle east respiratory syndrome (MERS) earlier.



4. Treatment : There's no specific treatment for coronavirus (COVID-19). People with COVID-19 should receive supportive care to relieve symptoms. Currently there is no vaccine to prevent the disease.



2. How and when it emerged: The current strain is a zoonotic virus first popped up on global radar in December 2019, after it was first detected in Wuhan City, in the Hubei province of China. Initially, the virus existed in animals but was transmitted to humans. Open markets are believed to be part of the transmission where livestock is close to food and people with that kind of market setup.



5. Spread : The disease spreads from person to person through small droplets from the nose or mouth when a person infected coughs or exhales. People can also catch COVID-19 by touching objects or surfaces (where droplets land), then touching their eyes, nose or mouth.



3. Symptoms : Most common symptoms are fever, tiredness, and dry cough. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure and vary in severity.



6. Measures : Simple measures like washing your hands often with soap and water and maintaining social distancing can help stop coronavirus spreading.







Leadership - Gratitude to Sanitation Workforce

The government announced special incentives to each sanitation worker in the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) and Hyderabad Metro Water Supply (HMWS) and their counterparts in municipalities and village panchayats.

The state government had taken the decision to express their gratitude to the work being done by the staff in ensuring that sanitation is maintained and the spread of the disease is curbed.

The state has 95,392 sanitation workers including employees of GHMC and HMWSSB.

An incentive to the employees of the Medical and Health Department was also announced in recognition of their services in combating the coronavirus.

Leadership - Funding for Sanitation ... prudent decisions



The Principal Secretary, MA&UD issued instructions not to compromise with sanitation maintenance in view of the coronavirus threat.

Release of funds for sanitation

The State Government has released funds to the tune of **Rs.181.50 crore** under the Land Regularisation Scheme (LRS) to the five districts under the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority (HMDA) limits and has directed district authorities to **intensify sanitation measures**.

There are 36 municipalities and corporations in the five districts, including Ranga Reddy, Medchal, Sangareddy, Yadadri and Medak. The funds were released to the municipalities in five districts following directions from the state.

For the safety of sanitary workers and employers, sanitisers, radium jackets, gloves and masks were made available at all attendance places in all GHMC offices. Officials were directed to ensure all the sanitation workers wear the safety personal protection equipment.

Procurement of Personal Protective Gear

Personal Protection Equipment: The state government is building enough stocks and adding up of PPE and other safety equipment to last comfortably for the entire cycle of the present coronavirus outbreak in Telangana. Realising that there is a shortfall of PPE equipment and masks from China, which is the largest exporter of such equipment, the State government has tied up with **local manufacturing companies** in Tamil Nadu and other States that will supply PPE and N95 masks in the coming weeks.

It has placed orders for **five lakh Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) kits** and **five lakh N95 masks** for healthcare and sanitary workers who are in the forefront in combating coronavirus. The government consulted distributors and manufacturers of medical equipment across India and placed orders for **procuring two crore surgical masks** and **one crore medical gloves** for government doctors and nurses. The orders for **3.5 lakh coronavirus testing kits** and **five lakh special safety eye-glasses** were also placed.

The **Telangana Prisons Department** is also manufacturing health and hygiene kits under the 'My Nation' brand comprising washable masks, hand sanitisers, handwash, bath soaps and phenyl. The inmates were **trained by chemists** on how to make sanitisers, while professional tailors at the prisons taught them how to stitch the masks. Around 9,000 face masks and 3,000 litres of sanitiser are being produced every day at Chanchalguda and Cherlapally central prisons in Hyderabad and other district jails.













Initiatives by SHGs, NGOs & Volunteer Groups



The **police, civil society organisations** and **volunteers** from across Telangana have joined forces to fight the coronavirus pandemic by helping the disadvantaged during the lockdown.

To ensure coordination, the Telangana Police started a WhatsApp group to help the supply of dry ration, food and essential services to migrant workers, shelter homes, and others who are stranded in the state due to the restrictions imposed to curb the spread of the disease.

Over 200 members of SHGs, attached to the District Rural Development Agency (DRDA) are stitching masks. The members who are familiar with tailoring and have experience in this field were tasked with producing the masks in view of the growing demand for it.

Self Helps Groups (SHGs)



The Self Helps Groups (SHGs) across the State are doing their bit in the fight against Covid-19 by stitching a bunch of masks every day. This is to overcome the shortage of face masks and increase their supply to sanitation workers and other frontline workers free of cost. The **TS Mission for Elimination of Poverty in Municipal Areas (MEPMA)** has been assigned the task of supervising the initiative. In every district, there are about 10 groups. Their target is stitching more than 4,000 masks, which are easy to wear and reusable.

As the State puts in all efforts to combat novel coronavirus risks, the personnel of the TSDRFS have been playing a quiet role during these trying times. A few thousand personnel of the department equipped with 132 fire tenders to use as these vehicles can hold huge amount of water and the personnel are professional in spraying using different water guns. As a priority, the fire department is visiting the hospitals, shopping malls, big commercial establishments, bus stations, railway stations and important thoroughfares across the State. Apart from disinfecting job, they have also prepared banners for public awareness and sensitising the people through audio messages. Nearly 300 DRF personnel underwent a three-day special training programme at DRF Centre on use of spraying machines, respirators etc.

Social Distancing ... the State's measures

Social distancing or physical distancing is deliberately increasing the physical space between people to avoid spreading illness. Staying at least six feet away from other people lessens your chances of catching COVID-19.

Complete Lockdown:

a state of isolation or restricted access instituted as a security measure.

The state has announced a complete lockdown in the state till April end in view of the coronavirus outbreak.

- all state borders have been sealed other than for movement of essential and perishable commodities
- all **public transport services** including TSRTC buses, SETWIN, Hyderabad Metro, taxis, auto-rickshaws **not permitted**.
- citizens were requested to stay at home and come out only for permitted activities while strictly observing social distancing norms during specific hours.
- quarantine persons shall strictly observe the same failing which he/she will be liable for penal action and shifted to government quarantine

Token System: State has introduced a system of issuing tokens with time slots to card holders, so that they don't gather at the fair price shops and come as per their allotted time. School buildings have been utilised to keep the stock. A vehicle with audio and speaker facility is used to make announcements in villages and residential areas in the city about the fair price shop timings, token system, time slots and other necessary norms to be followed.


- special care in disposing waste from quarantined households.
- to provide quarantine households with specially-marked yellow non-chlorinated garbage bags
- waste generated from quarantined houses would be treated hazardous biomedical waste.
- collected in separate collection vehicles and transported separately, and the vehicles would be thoroughly disinfected every day.
- ensure proper disposal of such waste only through incineration
- In case the incineration facilities are unavailable, these waste should be buried in a deep pit as a last resort, so that they cannot contaminate any other surface.
- sanitary staff involved in the collection and transportation of the hazardous waste should be provided with personal protective kits every day.
- before leaving for collection of waste and after returning to their duty station, every sanitary staff would be subjected to thermal checking.
- sanitary staff should deposit their used masks and gloves at a designated, cordoned-off area and such used protective gear should be treated as hazardous waste, to be disposed of through incineration.





Monitoring Mechanisms

COVID -19 Monitoring System App

Government of Telangana deployed India's first **automated monitoring app** developed by Vera Smart Healthcare to identify, undertake live surveillance, track, monitor, and provide real-time analytics to the Health Department.

The system empowers each health-caller to **handle 1500+ calls** and simple chatbot interaction every day with a patient to ensure that the symptomatic or confirmed 'positive', quarantined and is under treatment, helping to strengthen the COVID contacts outreach significantly.

The vital features of the app is **Geotagging** and **GPS tracking** of the home quarantined person, to ensure that he/she is not breaching the law of quarantine. With instant trace and trackability, accurate information is pushed to the authorities even if there is a breach.



COVID -19 Monitoring System – Touch Points

PHC sub-center

Around 4800 in number, receive data from the ASHA workers, push them to the next level.

PHC

- Public Health Centre, 886 in the state, flows out the data to the District Medical Health Officer.

DMHO

- The officer-in-charge takes charge of the situation in the respective districts by following the concerned hierarchical officer at the Health Department, to whom the data is transmitted.

This centre is operational 24x7 and we will be monitoring the situation. The Health Minister, Chief Secretary, Commissioner of Public Health and Family Welfare are part of the Command Control Centre.

Quarantine Facilities ... the makeshift hospitals facilitated by the State







The state has set up quarantine facilities at **Telangana State Forest Academy** in Dulapally and Haritha Valley View Resorts at Ananthagiri Hills in Vikarabad district. The **GMC Balayogi Athletic Stadium** in Hyderabad's Gachibowli is also being renovated and being converted to a **1500 bed hospital**. A huge water tank with a capacity to hold of 10 lakh litres of drinking water, sufficient to support at least 3,000 persons, is being constructed at the sports village. Separate facilities for health care workers and other staff is also being created at the quarantine facility.

Private medical college hospitals in Telangana are contributing by providing upto 15,500 beds for treating coronavirus patients in response to a government request for ramping up the capacity to meet any situation. The **21 colleges** together have 15,500 beds, including 1,100 in Intensive Care Units (ICU), and 200 ventilators.

T-CONSULT Project by Narayanpet Municipality



'T-CONSULT' project launched to treat people in rural areas with no access to doctors in villages. Citizen can book appointment with doctors of their choice and speciality through the tele-consult facility mediated by panchayat level officials who are the nodal officers. Doctors interact with patients and provide prescription which can be printed too. The project has been started in association with Telangana Information Technology Association (TITA) in 39 villages of Maktal Mandal in Narayanpet district and the program is being expanded to 10 more districts. Maktal will be recorded as the first mandal in the country to have 100% access to Telemedicine

The state government has started **paddy crop procurement centres** across the state amidst the COVID-19 lockdown. The paddy will be procured directly from farmers at Minimum Support Price (MSP). The state government has set up as many as **7,700 procurement centres** across the state. The government officials to procure the produce from the village-level without any hassles to farmers amidst the lockdown. The state government announced that it will buy crops worth over **Rs 25,000 crores** and declared **Rs 1,835 as MSP** without any ceiling on the produce that each farmer can sell. This means that farmers can sell their entire produce to the government if they wish to do so. Besides paddy, the government announced **Rs 4,875 for Bengal gram** per quintal and **Rs.5,650 for sunflower** (oilseed crop) at MSP.


