Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU)

(Commonly known as Family or In-law apartments)

Per Town of Seabrook's zoning an Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) is defined as a residential living unit that is within or attached to a single-family dwelling, and that provides independent living facilities for one or more persons, including provisions for sleeping, eating, cooking, and sanitation. ADU's are subject to the following restrictions:

- An ADU may not be converted to a condominium;
- An ADU may not be detached from the Single-Family Dwelling;
- Two off-street parking spaces are required for the ADU;
- There shall be no more than one ADU per lot;
- Either the ADU or the Single-Family Dwelling shall be owner occupied;
- The ADU shall be no larger than 750 square feet;
- The ADU shall contain no more than two bedrooms.
- An interior door shall be provided between the primary dwelling unit and the ADU.
- The ADU shall maintain an aesthetic continuity with the primary dwelling unit
