

Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine and Science College of Pharmacy Introductory Pharmacy Practice Experience (IPPE) Elective

Research

Overview

This practice experience will take place during the third professional year of the curriculum. It will satisfy 40 hours of the 300 hours allocated to IPPEs. Students will complete the 40 hours over the course of one week.

Elective Rotation Blocks

Subject to preceptor availability, students will be scheduled for their elective rotations during one of four blocks. Two of these blocks take place during the two weeks prior to the start of the P3 year and the other two blocks occur during the intersession breaks.

Practice Setting and Description

This IPPE elective will take place at Rosalind Franklin University College of Pharmacy. Students will work with faculty and staff within the College to gain an understanding of the research initiatives designed to impact pharmacy practice and patient care.

Educational Outcomes

Upon completion of the research IPPE elective, students will be able to:

- 1. Explain the role that the Institutional Review Board plays in research design and conduct.
- 2. Describe the process by which research objectives are developed and how these define the methodology.
- 3. Discuss the various types of research conducted by the College and how these may differ across departments.
- 4. Describe the ways in which research results and outcomes are analyzed.
- 5. Compare and contrast the different methods used to communicate research methodology and findings to others.
