Mission

Landmark's mission is to enable and empower students with language-based learning disabilities to reach their educational and social potential through an exemplary school program, complemented by outreach and training, assessment, and research.



History

Landmark School opened its doors in 1971 with 40 students and a small group of teachers on one campus. Today, the school serves 470 students on two North Shore campuses with a faculty and staff of 320. For more than 50 years, Landmark has grown and changed, yet always stays true to its mission.

Landmark School was founded by visionary Dr. Charles "Chad" Drake to educate students whose reading, writing, spelling, and math skills did not match their superior thinking and problem-solving capacities. Most called these children dyslexic or disabled. Chad saw their promise, and called them bright and capable.

Program

Landmark's approach is what makes the School uniquely effective for students who struggle with reading, writing, listening, expressive language, and executive functioning skills. The Landmark approach is grounded in the science of reading and structured literacy. The school is language-based, skills-based, and utilizes direct and explicit instruction across the entire curriculum.

Landmark designs an individualized program specifically for each student to focus on their strengths and interest while bolstering their areas of need. Through diagnostic testing, guidance from academic advisors, small classes, one-to-one tutorials, and more, each student has a personalized program. It's what education should be—and it works!

Since the School's founding, Landmark has maintained the core Six Teaching Principles (™) that they continue to apply today. These principles are the backbone of Landmark's teaching methodologies and represent proven, effective, researched-based teaching practices for all learners, not only students who struggle with reading, writing, speaking, and auditory processing.

Landmark's Six Teaching Principles (™):

- 1. Provide opportunities for all students to experience success.
- 2. Use multisensory approaches to teach.
- 3. Use micro units and structured tasks for every student.
- 4. Ensure optimization through practice and review.
- 5. Provide models for students to use as guides.
- 6. Include Landmark students in the learning process.

Landmark offers a vast array of after-school activities, clubs, athletics, activities, community events, and community service for high school students. Landmark encourages students to respect themselves, their peers, and their environment. Student life staff organize community events, evening and weekend activities, and educational forums. Students are encouraged to participate in a broad array of activities and interscholastic sports that interest them, all to challenge themselves by exploring new endeavors.





Campus and Location

Landmark's High School sits on a sprawling campus overlooking the Atlantic Ocean in Prides Crossing, Massachusetts, just 30 miles north of Boston. The school takes full advantage of its proximity to Boston, collaborating with research institutions, such as Harvard University and Boston Children's Hospital, to continuously inform its practice. Landmark High School is just a few miles from downtown Beverly, Massachusetts, which offers multiple cafés and restaurants, shops, a movie theater, and concert hall.

The North Shore of Boston is a significant historical, cultural, and economic region of Massachusetts. The area is loosely defined as the seacoast between Boston and New Hampshire. The area's landscape includes seaports, fishing villages, and dramatic coastline dotted with marshes and wetlands, as well as beaches and natural harbors.
