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Overview

Chesapeake Bay Academy is the only independent school in southeastern Virginia specifically dedicated to serving students in grades 1-12 with a variety of learning differences. These students thrive. The school is renowned for its small class sizes, personalized instruction, multi-sensory curriculum, project-based learning, and emphasis on social-emotional development.

Licensed by the Virginia Department of Education as a private day school for students with specific learning disabilities, Chesapeake Bay Academy serves 110 students, many of whom travel significant distances to benefit from its specialized approach.

Strong Leadership & Strategic Vision

Chesapeake Bay Academy is guided by a dynamic and forward-thinking leadership team and Board of Trustees—an uncommon strength for a small school. The Board embraces a strategic framework inspired by Jim Collins, the best-selling author of Good to Great. This philosophy emphasizes a dual commitment: holding steadfast to the Academy's core values while continuously evolving, innovating, and improving to meet the needs of a changing world, the recipe for long-term excellence.

In addition to its comprehensive academic program, Chesapeake Bay Academy has developed two strategic initiatives that significantly enhance its impact:

- The Center for Educational Research and Technological Innovation (CERTI)
- CadetNet, a virtual online educational program

Chesapeake Bay Academy was recently recognized by the Yass Foundation as one of the most innovative schools in the country. Grants from the foundation and other sources have allowed the school to launch its own research on virtual learning, further strengthening its commitment to educational innovation. The research center supports the Academy's core academic program and welcomes university-based researchers in partnership with Virginia Wesleyan University.

The Academy's partnership with Virginia Wesleyan University is both comprehensive and mutually beneficial. This collaboration provides student teachers, interns, and faculty access to university professors while affording Chesapeake Bay Academy employees full rights and privileges to the university's facilities and degree programs. With over 1,600 students, Virginia Wesleyan is a private liberal arts and sciences university located right next door to Chesapeake Bay Academy.

Mission: The mission of Chesapeake Bay Academy is to educate students to academic programs individualized to address their learning differences, empowering them with the skills and confidence necessary for success in higher education, careers, and life.

Program

Chesapeake Bay Academy is focused on creating the most innovative approaches for every student that they serve. Faculty are provided the freedom and support to develop impactful individualized academic programs. Faculty culture is centered on teamwork and support.

Chesapeake Bay Academy is divided into three divisions. Students in the lower school are grouped in homerooms by age and receive core academic instruction and ability-based groupings across the division. As is true throughout the school, students are grouped in very small classes which supports individual and small group instruction for content and social skills.

Middle school students receive direct instruction in reading and math while focusing on organizational skills and academic independence. Students move from subject to subject and receive support from their teachers developing an understanding of themselves as learners.



The High School has a rigorous curriculum that is focused on academics, as well as technology-based skills with honors options available. Standard and advanced diplomas are offered based on the students interest and ability levels. In the High School, Chesapeake Bay Academy partners with Virginia Wesleyan University, to offer the advanced scholars a dual enrollment program. Students learn to understand and articulate their learning needs in preparation for life after graduation.

Location

Chesapeake Bay Academy has a wonderful campus building that is well cared for and provides three stories of academic program opportunities. The campus promotes a peaceful, calm ambience.

Chesapeake Bay is the nation's largest estuary with 3,600 species of plants, fish and animals. The city of Norfolk is very welcoming and the perfect mix of city energy and community charm. It is home to the world's largest naval base and NATO headquarters. Recently, USA today determined that Norfolk was one of the top 10 booming downtowns in the United States. The community also has a 3% lower cost of living average making it affordable. - Embracing the need to be the school's chief fundraiser and visible community presence.







- Demonstrating the executive skills that will both promote clear decision-making and allow decisions to be known. Authenticity and transparency are or will be critical.
- Organizing strategic challenges and opportunities, including co-curricular programs and athletics.
- Creating a shared vision. Work with the outstanding team of board members, administrators and faculty to create an exciting vision for Chesapeake Bay Academy, making this vision a reality.
- Hiring and retaining faculty with attention and care to salaries, workloads, and job expectations.
- Devoting care and attention to the two newest programs; CERTI and CadetNet.
