- Be a visible presence in all areas of the school.
- Be knowledgeable and able to articulate the developmental needs of the students while staying current with educational research and emerging trends.
- Make classroom visits and work collaboratively with teachers to integrate developmentally appropriate initiatives and resources into the school program.
- Support a division climate that is supportive and reflects high morale.
- Be aware of the educational, physical, social, and psychological needs of the students of the division, and develop plans for meeting those needs.
