The philosophy of the Winston School is truly reflected in the school's Mission Statement: "a small college preparatory school, designed to maximize the potential of bright students who learn differently." Through individualized learning strategies, Winston students are empowered to meet confidently the challenges of tomorrow. Learning differences are unique to the individual and may be manifested differently in various academic areas. Each student deserves the opportunity to learn in the manner

appropriate for their own distinctive style. Through Winston's testing and evaluation center, students are assessed, and teachers are provided with learning profiles, training, and resources necessary to respond to the needs of each matriculated student.

Winston School-Dallas is situated in a beautiful residential neighborhood in North Dallas. The school is easily accessible from all parts of the greater Dallas/Fort Worth metropolitan area. Its campus, while small in space, is large in accommodation and safety, providing tremendous space for the multi-variable programs that the school offers its students. Walking through the hallways is a joy as student artwork and projects are celebrated, evidenced, and displayed. PROGRAM AND COMMUNITY

Winston emphasizes core studies in reading, literature, writing, math, science, and social studies and creates a challenging academic environment that instills confidence. The rigorous curriculum is also supplemented with five specialized programs: Fine Arts

Academy, Performing Arts Academy, Solar Science Academy, Science-Learning Academy, and World Cultures Academy. These programs enhance creativity, team building, problem solving, and innovative thought processes.

Each of the academies require application and acceptance into the program as they involve extensive additional coursework, where students can specialize in one or more areas of particular interest.

The academies provide a unique perspective for Winston students and go into great depth in each of the given subject areas. The programs are exciting and unique to a school such as Winston. Winston is comprised of three distinct divisions: Lower School(K-6), Middle School (7–8), and Upper School (9–12).

In the Upper School, Winston provides an extensive college counseling program and adheres to its mission to assist students' search for the college that best aligns with the student's interest, abilities, and individual learning style. The school stresses the importance of looking for the best college fit for each. The counseling process begins early in the sophomore year and continues through graduation. Winston's counseling staff guides students and their parents through a step-by-step

approach to ensure success. This process has proven successful, and it is well known that colleges and universities regularly seek Winston students. Winston graduates attend many well-known 4-year colleges and universities and have received substantial scholarships based on their academic preparation and readiness.

The fine and performing arts programs at Winston are among the most outstanding in accredited independent schools. The program provides students numerous opportunities for pursuing their artistic and performing talents. The goal of the school and the department is to open the students to possibilities, while acknowledging their talents in celebrating their gifts. A walk through the hallways gives one a sense of the enriched programming and a deep appreciation for the Winston art program. The powerful program allows students in kindergarten through grade 12, the opportunities to develop and hone their individual talents by offering classes in visual arts, music, and theater, while learning about artists, design principles, and art culture.

Winston athletics is an integral part of the program to maximize the potential of its students. It is clearly student-centered with an emphasis on citizenship, sportsmanship on and off the field, a commitment to teamwork and teammates. Each student athlete, learns the importance of teamwork, building confidence, and learning new skills by playing a sport. Good coaches and



a wide range of sports options help students develop discipline, place others before self, and handle both joy and disappointment with grace and a generous spirit.

Winston clearly underscores four requisites for their student athletes: 1) representing their school well, 2) treating teammates and themselves with dignity and humility, 3) being good citizens on and off the field, and 4) becoming leaders by holding themselves and others to the high standards of the school. Winston offers a variety of sports for the upper and middle school students and retains a strong sports program in upper elementary.

Winston provides strong extracurricular activities as many students may not have had such opportunities in their previous schools. The faculty and staff understand the gifts and challenges of each student. While academics

are important, so are modeling and coaching of the students and the navigation of important social relationships and connections. It is true that Winston students need to work harder to navigate life in college and beyond.

Parents indicate that Winston equips children with an individualized instructional program and schedule that benefits academic growth, maturation, and social relationships with precision, warmth, and continual attention. Parents report that, "There's a great emphasis on the arts, and Winston intentionally celebrates and cultivates the unique creativity of children through academics and after-school activities and clubs, by investing in resources and opportunities that provide each student the ability to develop a true skillset and talent in engineering, arts, and design."

STRENGTHS, CHALLENGES, AND OPPORTUNITIES

Communication

The next head of school must possess the eloquence and passion to captivate and inspire the students, faculty, staff, alumnae and parents at Winston. The head's clear and compelling communicative style should capture the essence of LD education and must also be able to articulate unequivocally the benefits of a comprehensive program for students who learn differently. The head's ability to listen actively, speak effectively, and build community are

pivotal communication skills for success. The new head's ability to tell the story of Winston's history and its success to imparting the excitement of educational possibilities are pivotal to drive the school to continued strength.

Financial Sustainability and Enrollment

Like most independent schools today, Winston must establish long-term financial sustainability. The school will need a leader prepared to meet critical, competing challenges: grow its financial base and revenue streams, continue to attract and to compensate outstanding faculty, remain accessible to a wide range of bright and energetic children, sustain and refresh its excellent programs, and steward and enhance its campus.

Organization Health:

The next head of Winston will be the leader in sustaining an organization that appreciates and values "personal best" for adults, as well as the students. This new leader must inspire and build a culture of mutual respect for the various roles that all employees embrace. In addition, the head must clearly delineate how decisions are made and implemented. Clarity of goal setting and the willingness to undertake difficult decisions are essential skills. The head must also be able to lead productive community-wide discussions and manage complex issues.

Fundraising and Building Alliances

effective, strategic alliances are necessary for the future of Winston. The next head of school must forge relationships to support and propel forward new programs, campus enhancements, curricular needs, and sustainability initiatives. The head must be comfortable and confident in the quest for philanthropic support, must be adept at communicating with the current and former families of the school, and must continue to deepen the connection to and among graduates. Connections to other thriving LD day programs, regionally and nationally, and building community relationships are important, as well.

Talent Identification

Talented administrators, faculty, and staff are the backbone of

delivering the quality program at Winston. The new leader must have a proven track record of identifying, attracting, and retaining outstanding administrators, faculty, staff, and volunteers. Familiarity with and adherence to the LD principles of exceptional practices in talent search coupled with meaningful evaluations of performance are essential as the school seeks to motivate and retain the very best employees and school volunteers. Additionally, an assessment of roles and responsibilities needs to be conducted to ensure that personnel are appropriately assigned to maximum advantage.

Campus and Facilities

The campus is a beautiful place to teach, learn and thrive. The next

head must value the relationship with the neighborhood, its easy accessibility and the current and proposed uses of the campus. Addressing all-campus security should be a significant priority, while quality maintenance, upkeep of new instructional and performing spaces, and a deep respect for the environment and conservation of natural resources will also be necessary.

Professional qualifications and personal qualities:

The next head of school for Winston should have the appropriate academic qualifications, including a master's degree, as well as a successful track record in addressing the opportunities and challenges for leading the school into the next decade.

- Well-honed communication skills, with a strong grasp for active listening and a propensity for authentic engagement and trusting conversations
