Visualizations

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Equatorial Guinea is the 84th largest export economy in the world. In 2013, Equatorial Guinea exported \$12.8B and imported \$2.71B, resulting in a positive trade balance of \$10.1B. In 2013 the GDP of Equatorial Guinea was \$15.6B and its GDP per capita was \$33.8k.

The top exports of Equatorial Guinea are Crude Petroleum (\$8.65B), Petroleum Gas (\$3.03B), Acyclic Alcohols (\$455M), Refined Petroleum (\$221M) and Other Sea Vessels (\$209M), using the 1992 revision of the HS (Harmonized System) classification. Its top imports are Other Construction Vehicles (\$484M), Iron Structures (\$113M), Refined Petroleum (\$111M), Excavation Machinery (\$107M) and Insulated Wire (\$84.1M).

The top export destinations of Equatorial Guinea are China (\$2.19B), Japan (\$1.81B), the United Kingdom (\$1.65B), France (\$1.37B) and Spain (\$976M). The top import origins are the United States (\$713M), Spain (\$442M), China (\$356M), France (\$152M) and Italy (\$138M).

Equatorial Guinea borders Cameroon and Gabon by land and Nigeria and Sao Tome and Principe by sea.

Exports

In 2013 Equatorial Guinea exported \$12.8B, making it the 84th largest exporter in the world. During the last five years the exports of Equatorial Guinea have decreased at an annualized rate of -0.1%, from \$12.8B in 2008 to \$12.8B in 2013. The most recent exports are led by Crude Petroleum which represent 67.7% of the total exports of Equatorial Guinea, followed by Petroleum Gas, which account for 23.7%.

In 2013 Equatorial Guinea imported \$2.71B, making it the 159th largest importer in the world. During the last five years the imports of Equatorial Guinea have increased at an annualized rate of 11%, from \$1.61B in 2008 to \$2.71B in 2013. The most recent imports are led by **Other Construction Vehicles** which represent 17.9% of the total imports of Equatorial Guinea, followed by **Iron Structures**, which account for 4.21%.

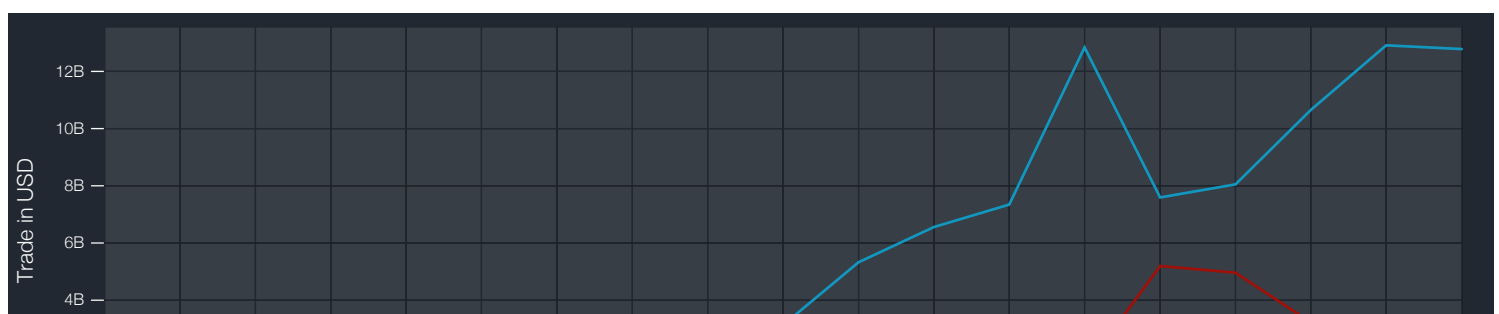


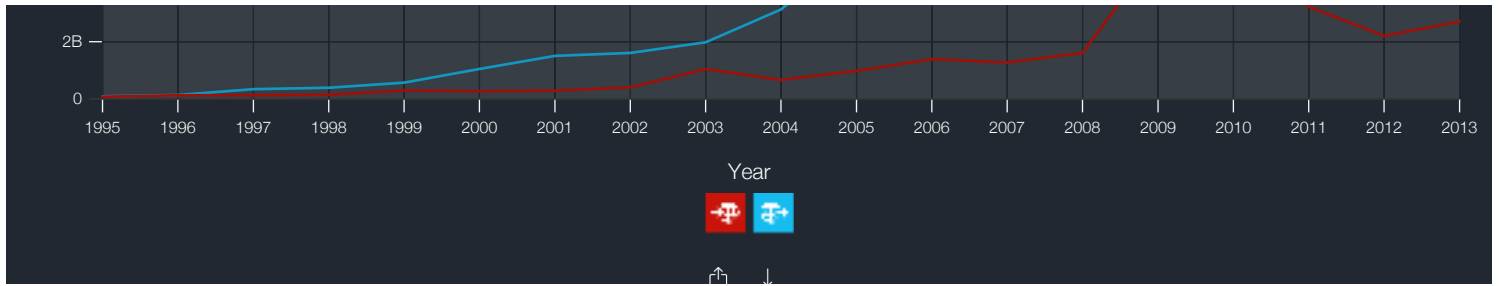

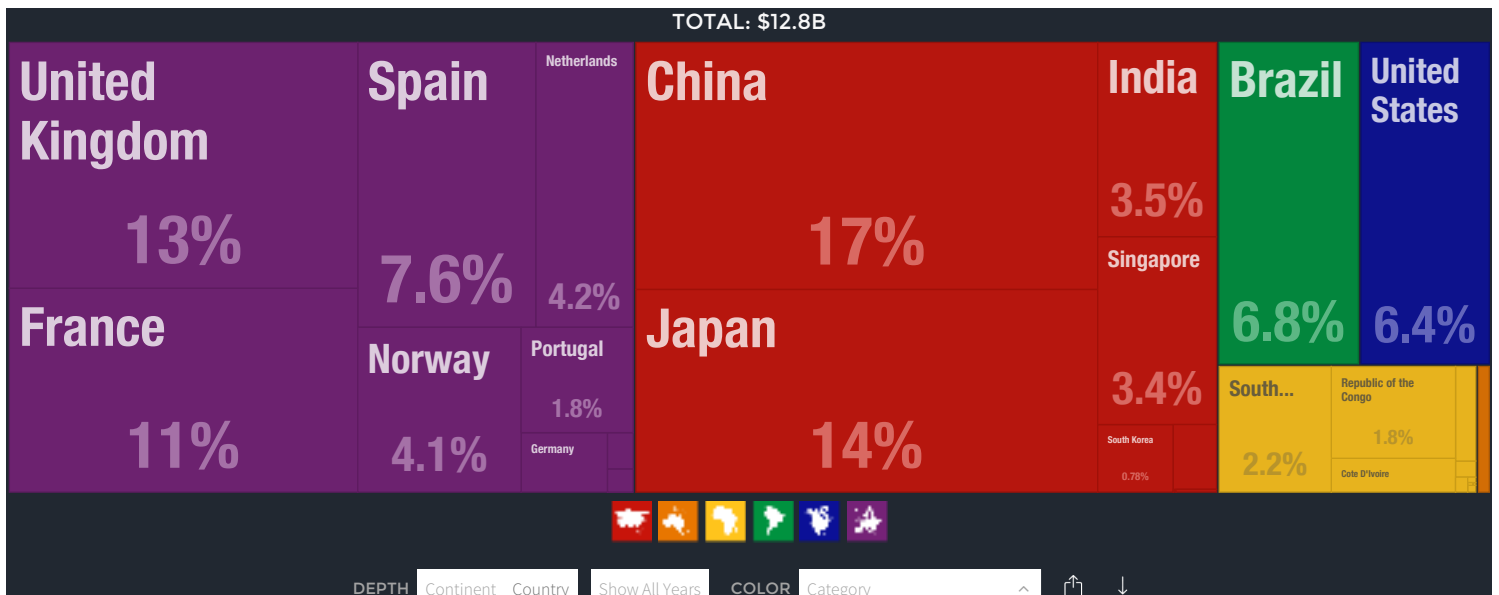


Destinations

Product Space

The product space is a network connecting products that are likely to be co-exported and can be used to predict the evolution of a country's export structure.

Equatorial Guinea exports 7 products with revealed comparative advantage (meaning that its share of global exports is larger than what would be expected from the size of its export economy and from the size of a product's global market).
