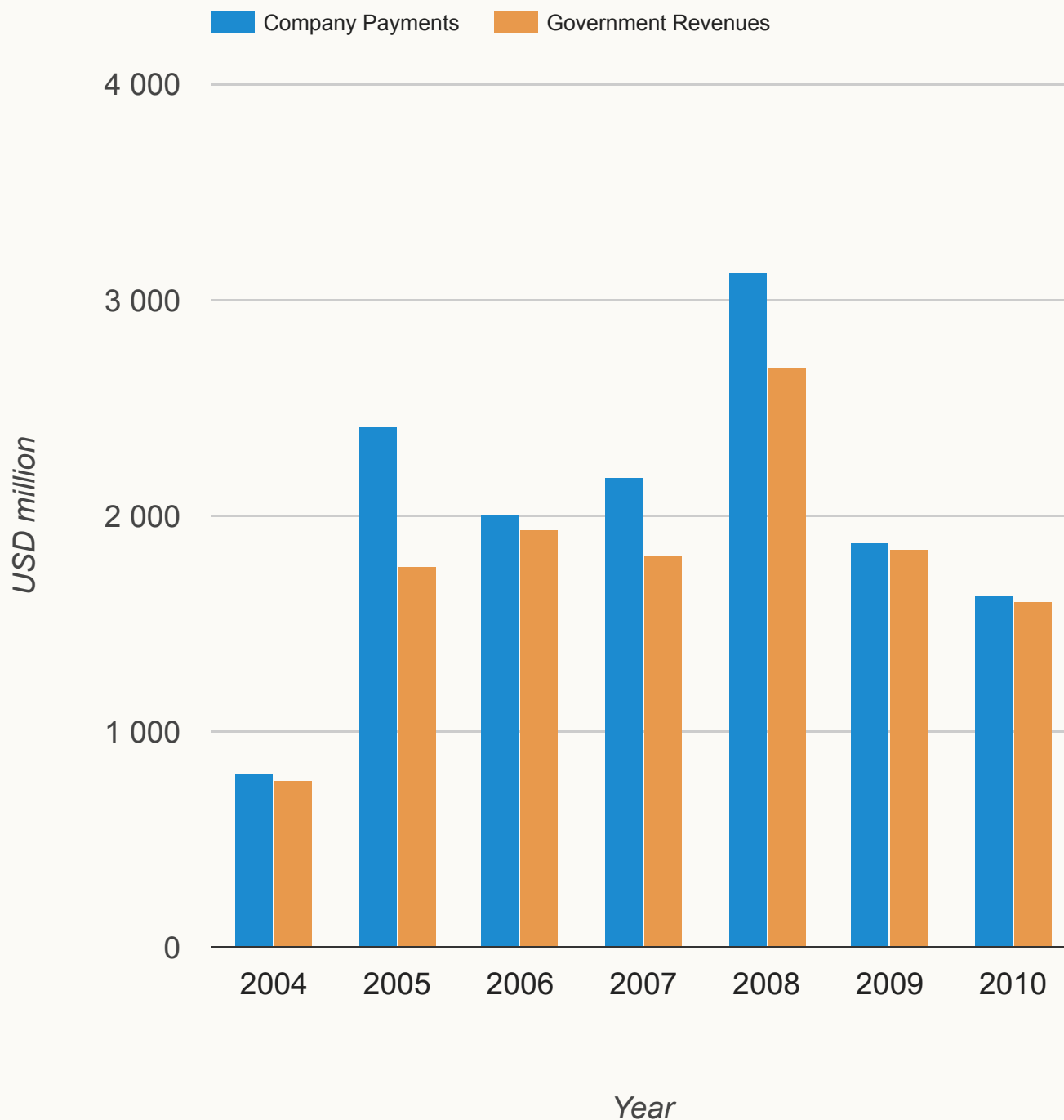
Extractive Industries

Gabon's mineral industry is dominated by the production of manganese and petroleum. In 2010, the country ranked 4th among the world's leading producers of manganese, accounting for about 11% of world production. Crude petroleum production accounted for about 75% of the country's total exports, 60% of Government revenue, and 40% of the country's gross domestic product.

EITI Reporting

The country produces EITI Reports that disclose revenues from the extraction of its natural resources. Companies disclose what they have paid in taxes and other payments and the government discloses what it has received. These two sets of figures are compared and reconciled.

The reports covering oil and mining revenues in 2007-2008 and 2009-2010 were published in October 2012

The most recent [EITI report?](#) (covering 2009 and 2010) was published in early October 2012. The report covering 2007 and 2008 was published on 28 October 2012.
