Tunisia is the first country in the Middle East and North Africa region to release budget and expenditure data to the public using BOOST. The Tunisia BOOST database provides disaggregated budget data of the central government from 2008 - onwards.

The development of the database was a joint endeavor of the World Bank and the Tunisian Ministry of Finance. The Tunisia BOOST database covers budget data for all ministries from 2008 onwards that is presented according to an administrative/functional, economic, and programmatic classification.

The Tunisian national budget is structured according to an administrative and economic classification; with the latter identifying project level data as well. In the 2013 budget, a programmatic classification was further added and adopted by four pilot ministries. The government of Tunisia expects an additional 5 ministries to adopt this classification in time for the 2014 budget and another 9 ministries in 2015.

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
