## Extractive Industries

The Chadian economy is highly dependent on the oil sector since production began in 2003. The USD 2 billion of government revenues from the oil, gas and mining sector accounted for 70% of the government budget, according to the 2012 [EITI Report](#)<sup>?</sup>. In 2013, the hydrocarbon sector accounted for 90% of exports, more than 70% of Government revenues, and about 30% of the nominal gross domestic product, according to the US Geological Survey. [The Wall Street Journal](#) reported in June 2014 that Glencore helped finance Chad's USD 1.3 billion acquisition of Chevron assets in seven oil fields and the Chad-Cameroon pipeline. These oil backed loans and increased dependence on the hydrocarbon sector have amplified Chad's exposure to the risk of oil price volatility.

CNPC International (Chad) Ltd., which was a subsidiary of China National Petroleum Corp., operated the Koudalwa and the Ronier oilfields on Block H according to the [USGS, 2013 Country Report](#). In August 2014, the Government of Chad imposed a USD 1.2 billion fine to CNPC and subsequently suspended CNPC's [license](#)<sup>?</sup> to operate, due to environmental violations.

Exploration and production operations resumed in October 2014, following payment of a fine.

EITI Reports showed a decline of oil production from 180,000 barrels per day in 2005 to 110,000 barrels per day in 2012, which underlines the finite nature of these resources and the need for

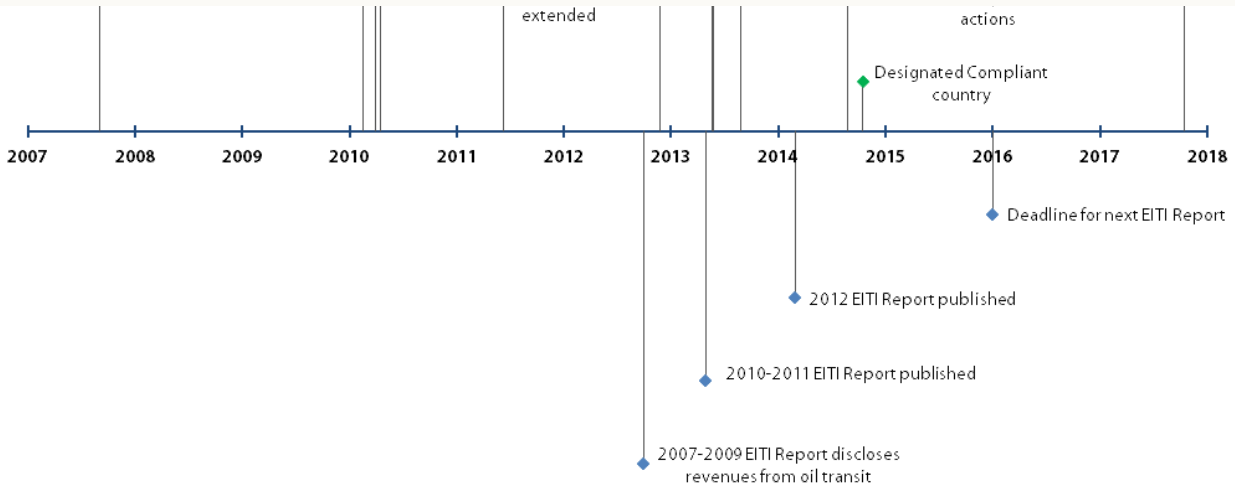
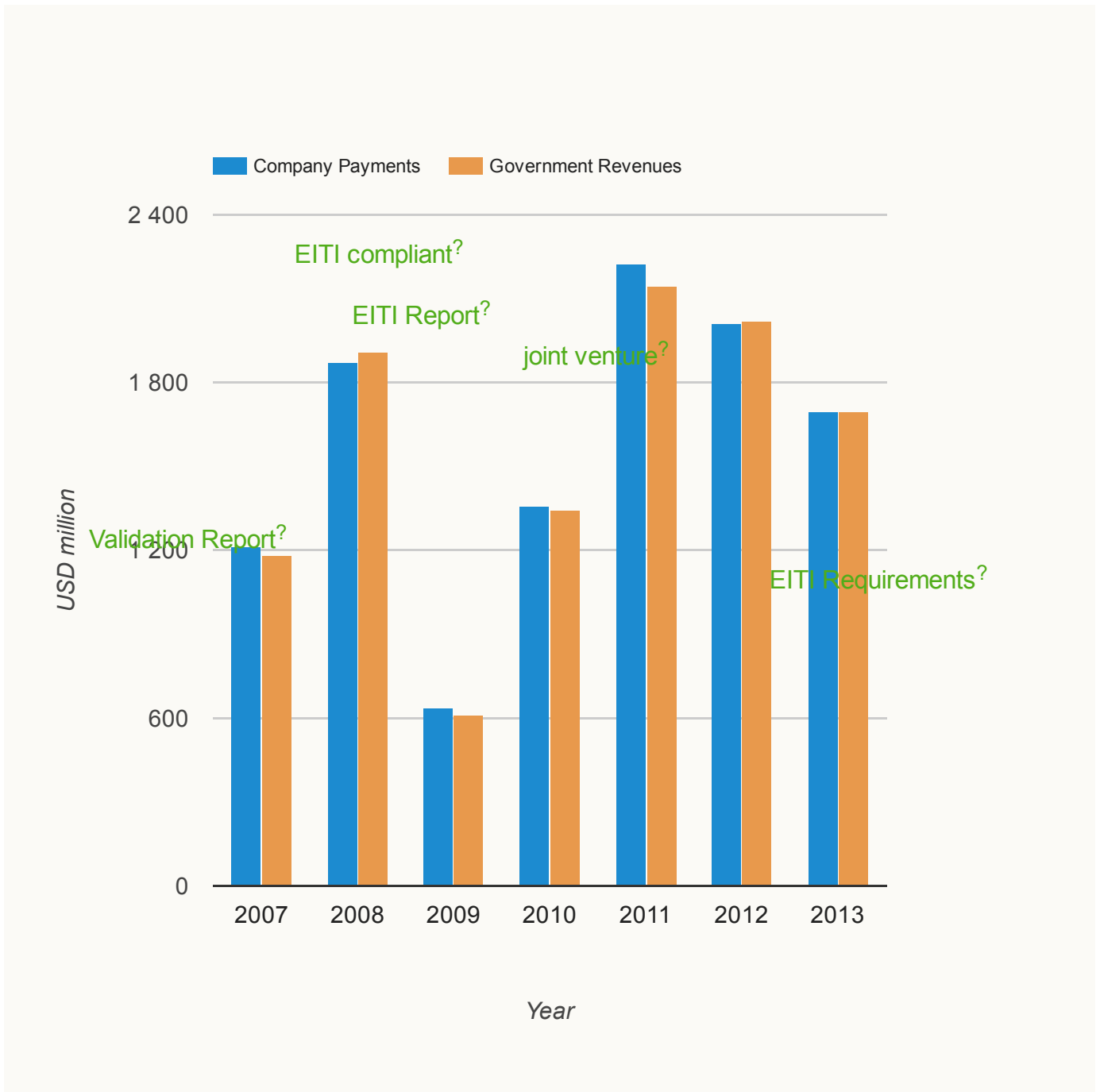
better management of revenues. **Good governance?** of oil revenues has proved to be challenging as demonstrated by the EITI reporting process. The Petroleum Revenue Oversight and Control Committee, as well as the national EITI **multi-stakeholder group?** aim to address these challenges and provide **transparency?** and oversight.

There are limited exploration activities for solid minerals including clay, gold, and uranium according to the [USGS, 2013 Country Report](#).

## EITI Reporting

*The country produces EITI Reports that disclose revenues from the extraction of its natural resources. Companies disclose what they have paid in taxes and other payments and the government discloses what it has received. These two sets of figures are compared and reconciled.*

The 2012 Report was published in March 2014. Preparatory work related to the publication of the 2013 Report is on-going.
