

# **Diabetes Camps**

There are a number of camps available for children and teenagers with diabetes. The camps below are all located in Indiana or a neighboring state.

## **Camp John Warvel**

Camp John Warvel is sponsored by the American Diabetes Association (ADA), Indiana Affiliate. The camp is located near North Webster, Indiana. Camp sessions typically take place in June and are for children ages 7 to 15 years old. A full-time medical staff of doctors, nurses and dietitians from the Pediatric Diabetes Program at Riley IU Health provides 24-hour care for campers. #### **Camp Until a Cure**

Camp Until a Cure is sponsored by the Diabetes Youth Foundation of Indiana. The camp is located in Noblesville, Indiana. Camp sessions are held in the summer and are for children ages 7 to 15 years old. Day camp is available for children ages 5 to 8 years old. The Center for Courageous Kids is a nonprofit medical camping facility founded by the late Ms. Betty Turner Campbell and funded entirely by donation. A weeklong camp for children ages 7 to 15 with diabetes is held in the summer. The camp also hosts family retreats on weekends. Camp for Courageous Kids is located in Scottsville, Kentucky. The on-site medical center is integral to the camp and made up of volunteer doctors and nurses and other medical personnel.
