

External Fixator Pin Site Care

Pin sites need to be cleaned two times a day.

Cleaning Supplies You Will Need

- Cotton swabs
- Half strength peroxide
 - To make half strength peroxide, mix peroxide with the same amount of water. For example, mix 10 mL of water with 10 mL of peroxide.

Cleaning Steps

- 1. Wash your hands with soap and water. Scrub them for 15 seconds. Rinse them.
- 2. Dry your hands with a clean towel.
- 3. Clean around the pin site with a cotton swab. Use a new cotton swab for each pin site. If there are "crusties" on the pins, try to get them off. The nurse will show you how.

Your child can take a shower if the doctor says it is OK. Use antibacterial soap like Dial or Ivory for children with sensitive skin.

If the pin sites drain fluid, check the color.

- If the color is clear yellow, that is normal.
- If the color is white, yellow, green or cloudy, call the doctor.

Call the doctor, if your child has:

- Fever
- Increased pain
- White, green or cloudy yellow fluid from the pin sites
