- Following feeding, horses are turned in to their paddocks with the appropriate weight blankets and the exerciser rotations are started.
- While the exerciser groups are rotated through, stalls are mucked out and water buckets are thoroughly scrubbed and refilled.
- Following all of the exerciser group rotations, the exerciser is cleaned and hay and waters are checked both inside the barn and in the paddocks; the aisles are swept and blankets are changed for some horses, after which turnout is switched if needed.

- Managed about 45 horses for morning feeding and checked for visible injuries, plus cleaned and filled outside water troughs and fed other barn animals.
- Following the horses being turned out into the paddocks, the stalls would get mucked and the aisle would get swept.
- Assisted beginner equestrians in bringing in their horses, grooming and tacking up if needed, and helped the instructor get the students mounted up.
