Poster: "Collections Management at the Arkansas Archeological Survey: A View from Old Washington" **Nov. 2022**

I served as the primary author of a poster presented at the Southeastern Archeological Conference, in which I received editorial assistance from Catherine Clayton and Dr. John Samuelsen.

Abstract: The proliferation of archaeological investigations in the twentieth century has resulted in a backlog of collections awaiting inventorying at many institutions. In an effort to remedy this issue, a digital collections database was created by the Arkansas Archeological Survey to inventory artifacts and easily share data across this statewide organization. Created in 2017 using a combination of MySQL and FileMaker, artifacts are entered by users and uploaded to a server in real-time. We will highlight the application of this system to collections from Old Washington, the Confederate capitol of Arkansas during the Civil War, which has produced thousands of artifacts during recent excavations.
