Conditions of acceptance: The Sturgis International Fellowship is awarded to you for the project you proposed in your application. The award will apply first to any outstanding balance on your University account prior to being available to you. You must be in good academic standing, and you are required to enroll for at least one credit every term for the duration of the project. As stipulated in the application and required by our Sturgis agreement, awardees must be enrolled as degree-seeking students for the duration of their Sturgis International Fellowship-funded project (the entirety of their S.I.F.-funded time abroad). If you are unable to travel during the period specified in your application, you must notify me immediately to obtain approval any changes to the proposed travel plan. Failure to obtain approval may result in revocation of the fellowship.

If your project involves human subjects, you must obtain IRB clearance before beginning your project (https://research.uark.edu/units/rscp/humans-as-subjects-in-research.php). Note: the IRB may not meet to review protocols during summer months; please plan accordingly.
