When something is applied by Jesus to Himself, then you know that you have an accurate application of the passage under consideration. That is the very thing Jesus does in Luke 4.18-21. He applies the passage, from Isaiah, to Himself. That makes our connection there absolutely certain.

We are going to look at an OT type, an event that was a shadow of the “real One.” We get to see the shadow in the OT long before we are able to learn the One who caused the shadow. As we read from these passages in Leviticus, and Isaiah, we will be looking backward with a “current view” of our knowledge of all the things Jesus was able to accomplish as a result of His death.

We will not exhaust all there is to think about Jubilee, but take notes about this event, as it a type of the real thing that Jesus has brought. He has brought spiritual freedom, and security, and brought it to the spiritually poor (Matthew 5.3) (who are like those who have sold themselves to fellow Israelites).

Let’s learn together. Get your pen and take good notes, as this study will be something you will want to reflect on throughout the week.
