In 1 Tim 5, Paul speaks to a problem with respect to younger widows in the church. And while he is giving them proper counsel in verses 14-15, he speaks of some dangers that are potential to them. He says that "they get into the habit of being idle and going about from house to house. And not only do they become idlers, but also busybodies who talk nonsense, saying things they ought not" (13). Paul did not want the behavior of these young Christians to be an opportunity for slander to be done by the enemy (14). In order to prevent the slander from the enemy, Paul encourages the younger widows to be very cautious in what they say, and to make sure they are not saying anything they ought not.

We can learn from this example that the words we say matter to God. Paul is encouraging us to restrict our words in an effort to follow the teaching of our Lord Jesus. And we will add to our knowledge of what to say when we must. We will learn not to slander and gossip from our study of God's word.

The words Jesus said mattered to God. He lived with this same measure of restriction applied to His words and He brought glory to God. We want to understand the heart and mind of Christ. Learning Him we will produce a deep concern for how we use our words.
