THIS MORNING: The thought is not original to me, but the principle is worthy of our consideration -- There is a very small percentage chance that my child will become a professional athlete, but there is a 100% chance that my children will appear before the judgment seat of God. Since that is the case, how serious should I take the preparation for my children, for myself, for my church family?

The day of the Lord is not something you can look at on a calendar and plan for. God did that on purpose and with a plan in place as to why. It is easy to consider that someone would take advantage of that particular setup and wait until the very last second to repent and become a Christian. However, because we know that is not how it works, we take God at His Word when He says it will come like a thief in the night and without warning.

The problem we face is that while this reality might be frightening for some, it should be something we are encouraged by as the children of God. This can potentially change our view and response to sermons or classes or discussions about the end of time. It can change us, if we will truly take Paul at his word, from a people worried about the end to a people who are excitedly waiting for that time when we will all go home to be with God.
