THIS MORNING: Has it ever crossed your mind that only two people in the history of the world have walked on top of water? Jesus, of course, did it and proved His standing as the Son of God by doing so, but Peter walked on water until he stopped focusing on Jesus.

"And Peter answered him, 'Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.' He said, 'Come.' So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, 'Lord, save me.' Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, 'O you of little faith, why did you doubt?'" (Matthew 14:28-31)

Two things to notice: 1) Peter did not hesitate to get out of the boat when Jesus instructed him to. 2) The Bible does not indicate that Peter sank immediately, but rather, he was 'beginning to sink.' These things are important because they sum us up so perfectly -- one minute we are eager to serve and are locked in on Jesus, the next we are feeling the water come up our body as we begin to sink. What causes this to happen? Simply put, it is the result of us shifting our focus away from Jesus and onto something else, someone else, or even the events of the world around us.

As we examine Hebrews 12:1-2 this morning, I pray that we do it with an open heart and open mind, eager to direct our minds to the One who can save us from our sins.
