## **Epaphroditus**

(Special thanks to Tom Larkin)

While no one ever wants to get sick, seven hundred miles from home is certainly not where vou would choose for it to happen. But that is exactly what happened to Epaphroditus. And he wasn't just sick – in fact, he almost died. He risked his life to complete the mission entrusted to him by his home church of Philippi. When he recovered, he began to worry – not about any residual effects from his sickness, but about the folks back home.

Because of the great distress that this situation was causing Epaphroditus, Paul sent him home. But Paul was very careful to protect the reputation of Epaphroditus. He reminded the church at Philippi of the great sacrifice Epaphroditus made to complete this work on their behalf. The second chapter of Philippians records Paul's description of Epaphroditus with terms like "my brother," fellow worker," fellow soldier," "your messenger and minister." And in no uncertain terms, he told them to "receive him in the Lord with all joy, and honor such men," when he again reminded them that Epaphroditus had risked his life to complete their service.

This entire episode happened as it did because everyone involved was willing to sacrifice for Christ. Philippi made sacrifices in order to send support to Paul. Epaphroditus sacrificed greatly taking Paul the gift. And Paul was willing to sacrifice a needed and effective worker so that others would have what they needed. In so doing, each one lived out the words of Romans 12:10 -"Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor."
