Today's Reading – Joshua 2:1-24; 6:22-25 Rahab

Rahab was a prostitute. I'm guessing she sometimes felt alone, worthless, rejected, and that no one cared or loved her. If we are all honest with ourselves, we have probably all been there. Rahab had great faith in the Lord. The only thing she knew about God were the stories she had heard - how the Lord dried up the Red Sea so the Israelites could walk through on dry land, and how the Israelites dealt with the kings of the Amorites. This is all she knew! This was the basis of her faith! Just some stories she heard passed around and, yet, her faith was that great. Great enough to give assistance to two spies she didn't know, to hide them in her house, and to lie to the king's men who came by to inquire about the two men. She also let them down out of her window and told them where to hide out for a few days. Because of that faith all her family would be saved when the Israelites destroyed Jericho. All that had to be done was to tie a scarlet cord in the window and Rahab and her household would be saved. Seems like an easy way to be saved. How many are out there today that have heard about the Lord more than Rahab and still don't want to do the things they need to do to be saved?
