They charge all cards a service fee of \$2.00 or 2.35%, which is the highest. Document formatting requirements The document must consist of one or more individual pages that are not permanently related or continuously related. White paper measuring no more than 8.5x14 inches and at least 8.5x11 inches is required. At the top of the first page, provide a 3-inch top of the field. The return address can be placed on the left side of this field, but the right side is reserved for the county auditor. The side and bottom margins on the first page should be 1 inch. All fields on the following pages must be at least 1 inch. Under the 3-inch upper field should be given the following information: document name; reference number of documents assigned or issued (if any); Names of grantees and grantees with a link to pages where additional names can be found (if any); abbreviated legal description (lot, block and unit/case number, or quarter, section, town and range); and the number of the parcel from the property tax of the appraiser (11 digits). The cover page can be used to meet the first page field and indexing requirements. When you use the cover page, one dollar will be added to the record fee. **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS** * No attachments should be fastened, glued or otherwise attached to any page. * The font size must be at least 8 points. * All pages must be cirracting and able to be depicted. * Paper should be the weight and color capable of producing images. * Ink should be a color capable of producing images. It is best suited black ink on white 20#. * All seals must beacern and able to be depicted. Pressure seals should be darkened. * The grantee must sign the document and must have his signature * Cases, contracts and mortgage properties described by lot and block or supplement and fee will not be filed or recorded until such supplement fee is filed and recorded. * Names appearing on documents must be printed manually, printed or printed under signatures to be legible. No instrument of sale or transfer carried out from the tax is accepted by the county auditor for filing or writing until the tax is paid and the payment check is affixed in it; in case the tax is not due to transfer, the instrument should not be so accepted until the appropriate designation of such fact has been made on the instrument by the Treasurer. Alle ansehen As our first presidential election during the global pandemic approaches, Thurston County Auditor Mary Hall doesn't mince words: If you know who you're going to vote for, fill in and return your ballot as soon as you get it. The team at the Thurston County Auditor's Office is critical to the success of our election. Team members take care of physical distance, hand washing and masks to stay healthy throughout the election cycle. Photo Courtesy: Thurston County Washington has been a state of voting by mail since 2011. We are in a better position than many other states to process what is likely to be a huge number of ballots because we are already used to receiving and processing ballots in this way. The biggest challenge of the COVID-19 pandemic presented by Hall and her team is to reduce the human capacity of the ballot processing center. When the time comes to count ballots, there will only be 30 or 40 workers on the floor decoration, not typical 80 to 100. We expect to receive 30,000 to 40,000 ballots on Election Day and the day after that, Hall explains. You can help reduce that number by returning your newsletter as soon as you can. Reducing the number of ballots returned and after Election Day means that votes are Thurston can be counted faster, faster, part to accelerate Washington's results. Auditors have spoken across the state and the results will be much slower, largely because we have half the staff working at this point in time, Hall continues. In the past, the Thurston County Courthouse hosted voter registration and ballot replacement. At the 2016 general election, we had lines out both doors, Hall says. She and her team knew they had to come up with a way to offer these vital services at a safe physical distance for the 2020 election cycle. They also needed a way to offer voters who are used to bringing this equipment to them to vote. In collaboration between South Puget Sound Community College (SPSCC) and the Audit Office, Hall's team took over the SPSCC bus loop to operate the Voting Centre. Intercity Transit will re-position its buses during the election cycle. Take a bus through a bus loop at the Mottman College South Puget Sound Community College campus to access voter registration services and replace ballots. Ampel signage will guide the way. Photo The author: Thurston County When a car pulls up, a member of the masked auditor's team greets the driver to find out if they need to register, get a replacement ballot or use disability access units to vote. A team member passes the request to a colleague at the next station, which prepares a voting package with the necessary materials. Even though the system was mostly running in the primaries, the auditor's team spent time in time and felt it could make waiting times shorter for the general election. A two-person team handled the main traffic. Hall says there will be five or six team members running in the general election trying to keep what is likely to be a larger volume of voters moving as quickly as possible. The hope is that most people will take care of their registration by the October 26 online deadline. The VOTING CENTER at the SPSCC's Mottman campus will open on Wednesday, October 14. Voting personality is not an option in Washington state, so it's important to note that the Voting Center is there for a voter registration person and replacement ballots just all the way through 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Only voters with disabilities are eligible to vote using disability access units. Sign up to vote or check the status of your registration on the VoteWA website by October 26. The voting center at the Mottman College campus at South Puget Sound College was created to keep voters safe. Friendly staff will do everything from them to help you register, replace your ballot or direct voters with disabilities to disability access units. Once you have a newsletter, Voting by mail is the safest way to vote, says Hall Hall We check the signature on the envelope against the signature we have in our voter registration system. The signature is similar to fingerprints, so we know the person who voted and signed that the ballot is the person who had the registration with this ballot. When you register online, the Audit Service extracts your signature from the license records department. If you're concerned about sending your newsletter by way of the U.S. Postal Service, Hall strongly recommends returning your ballot in one of the 29 ballot boxes around Thurston County. These bulletins are regularly collected by two of my employees and come directly to us, Hall explains. Transparency is key, says Mary Hall, Thurston County auditor. She's referring to this literally this year: origial barriers were built between each bulletin recycling station to prevent the risk of COVID-19 transmission. VoteWA.gov allows you to check the status of your ballot paper. If you wait until Election Day to return your ballot, you'll likely have to wait a few days, if not longer, to check for your ballot. You can also update your address voteWA.gov you have moved since the last election. You can also call the Audit Office at 360-786-5408 to update this information.
