

ADA SIGNAGE- SOME HELPFUL INFORMATION

The Americans With Disabilities Act(A.D.A.) Went into effect January 26,1992. As of July 26,1992,signs designating permanent spaces in places of public accommodation must include both tactile lettering and Grade 2 Braille.

DIRECTIONAL/INFORMATIONAL SIGNS:
must comply with character height,finish and contrast rules.Braille not required.

ACCESSIBLE FACILITIES:
marked with ISA
(wheelchair) symbol.

ACCESSIBLE ENTRANCES:
marked with ISA
(wheelchair) symbol



INACCESSIBLE ENTRANCES: directional signage to accessible entrance.

NOTE:This tactile/braille sign is designed based on our interpretation of the A.D.A. Legislation as it applies to permanent rooms and space identification. No warranty is implied.

TO BE IN COMPLIANCE,HANG SIGN:

- On latch side of door
- 60"from floor to center of sign
- 8"-12"from door frame to center of sign
- Person reading sign must be able to stand within 3" of it without hitting anything (plants,etc.) or coming within the swingpath of the door

TO HELP YOU HANG SIGN:

- Use attached self-adhesive strips
- Be sure wall surface is clean and dry
- Peel liner from strip
- Align sign in position and press
- To remove,slit strip with knife; peel remaining strip with thumbnail
