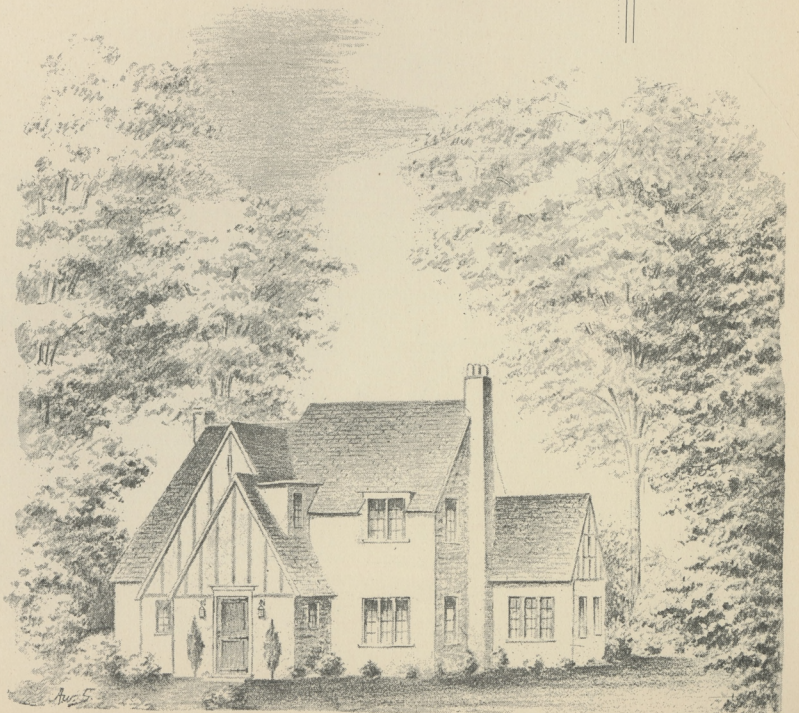

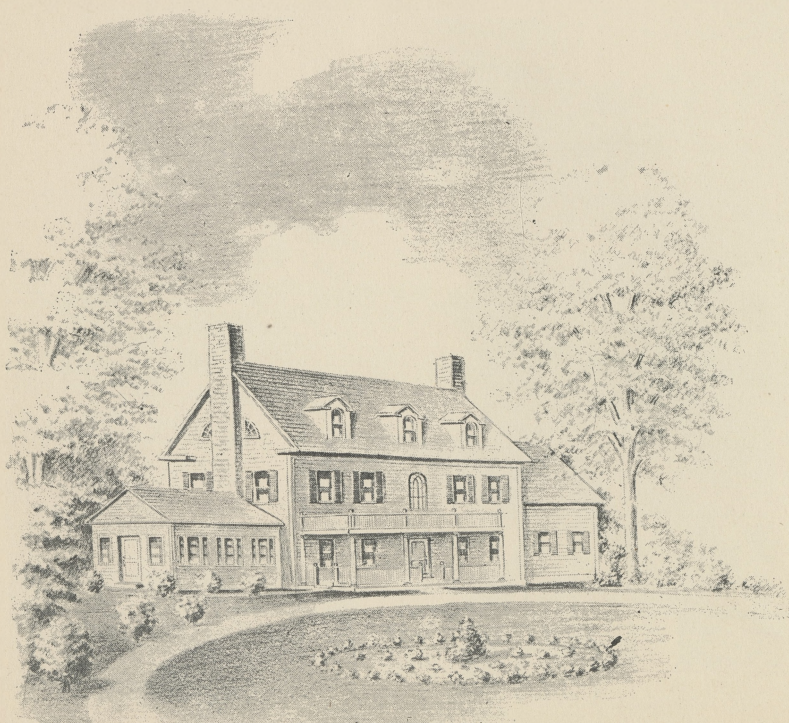

Early English and Colonial

HARDWARE

It cannot Rust

There is nothing in the metal of which this hardware is made which rust can attack. Succeeding generations will see it just as it is today, reproducing exactly the color of natural iron fresh from the hammer, or a deep, lustreless black. We have given you the true Colonial shapes, sizes, and colors, free from the bane of unsightly discolorations which occur wherever iron is used. No more streaks of iron rust upon the painted woodwork. No more soiled hands or gloves stained with yellow rust. No more roughened rust-bitten surfaces to mar the design. Just the true Colonial iron color, changeless and enduring.

The EH or "natural iron" finish

is made by substituting Colonium metal for iron. This is a Corbin compound which has every good quality required for hardware, and none of its defects. It is exactly of the color of hand-wrought iron. When the iron and Colonium hardware are mingled it is impossible to distinguish one from the other. Use will not change the color except as it wears the metal smooth. No atmospheric conditions can affect it. It will retain its original color in the salty air of the sea coast or any other trying location. The goods must be seen in order fully to realize the unchanging beauty of Corbin hardware made in the EH finish.

The DH or dead-black finish

Bronze metal made from new material is used here. It is indestructible, and the finish is the same deep, lustreless

black which has frequent use in fine buildings where there is much handling and where permanency of finish is desired. It is unchanging and in no way affected by time and exposure.

The surface is true to the originals

made two hundred or more years ago. The artist-blacksmiths of that day were skilled artificers, beating the heated iron to shape with hammer on anvil. They formed and finished each piece with nicety, smoothing out the hammer marks so far as they could, and even the rustic blacksmith used his best effort to produce a well-finished article. Such crudity as appeared was due to the nature of the tools and material or the lack of skill of the worker. *We have recreated the true Colonial finish.* The hammer marks appear just as the Colonial blacksmith made them, our own skilled workmen who have been wielding finishing hammers for more than twenty years executing the work with fidelity.

The designs are true to the period which created them

A number of the articles have been made by us for years for discriminating architects and home owners. A few of these have been given a place in our general catalog, but the greater number of them have been classed as "specials," made only upon individual orders. To these we have added others to complete the assortment. It is our desire to give to a larger number of the friends of Corbin hardware the benefits of our experience which have been enjoyed by a few. We have long been

in intimate contact with the revival of interest in the hardware of a former generation, and the articles which we list will be found faithful in form and spirit to the ideals of the period which created them.

Types will be found

sued to the Early English or Tudor Gothic structures; to the austere New England Colonial or to the Southern Colonial with its more enhanced elegance, reflecting a different culture; and to the newer form of residence to receive popular favor in which the Colonial motives were modified by the influences introduced by the Missions in the days of Spanish domination.

Many of the designs are duplicates of historic originals

There were many shapes and sizes of the hardware of pre-Revolutionary days. Good taste has led to the survival of favorite types, the less worthy ones disappearing through disuse. We have selected those which through their grace of form and their suitability have found favor through all the time which has passed since they were originally designed. They have a fitting place in homes which provide modern comfort in an old-time simplicity of setting. They are among the best of the designs

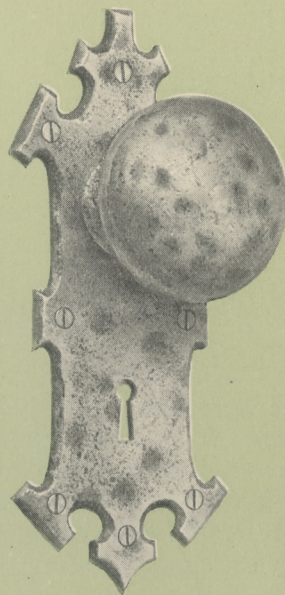
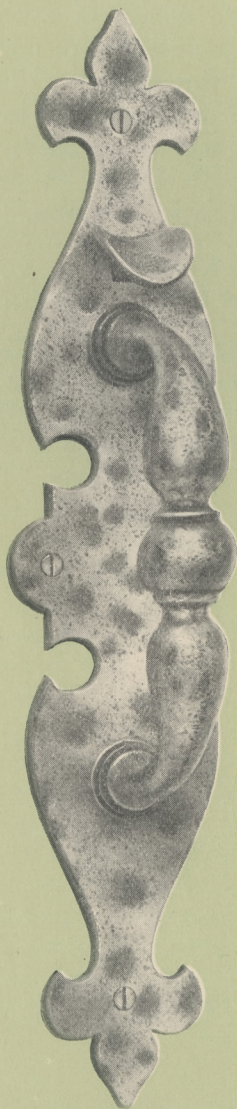
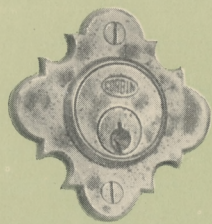
created by the artist-blacksmiths of their day, and have the approval of many architects who have employed them.

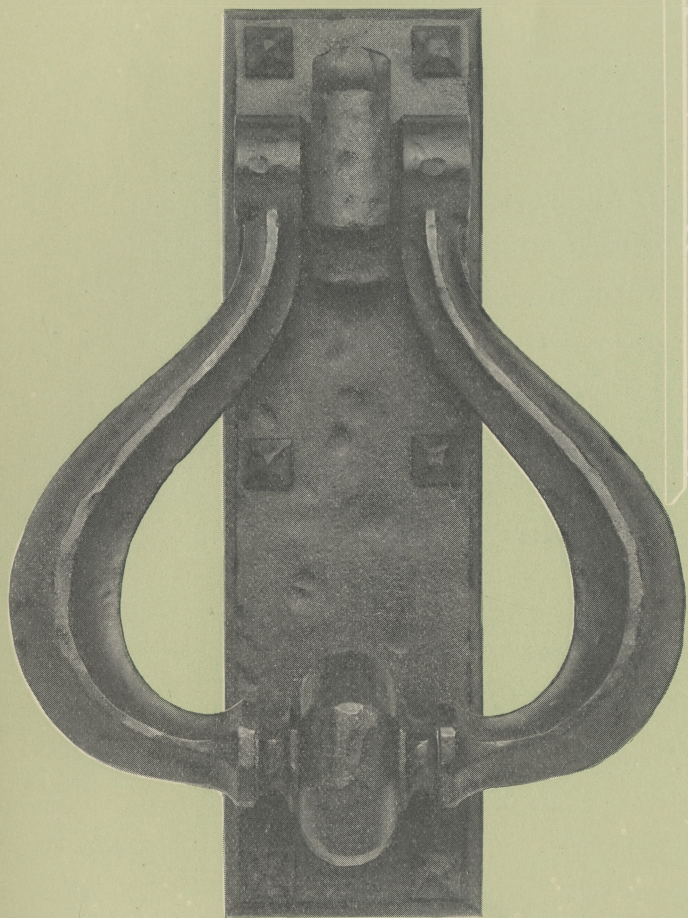
Not all Corbin Colonial Hardware

EH Finish

WITH the exception of bolts Nos. 7560, 7561, and 7562, all the articles shown in this book are made in Corbin EH finish. The color is changeless, and is exactly that of the wrought-iron hardware of Revolutionary days. The base is Colonial metal, which cannot rust. The castings are hand-finished, each piece being treated individually, reproducing with fidelity the product of the men who made the beautiful originals two hundred years ago.



DH Finish

ALL the articles shown in this book are made in Corbin DH finish. The base is cast bronze compounded in our own foundries from new metal. The color is a deep, lustreless black, not affected by time or exposure. Each piece is finished by hand, in exact reproduction of hand-forged iron.

Wrought Iron COLONIAL HARDWARE



WE present an assortment of New England Colonial hardware for those who desire harmony in detail in homes which reflect the spirit and motives of pre-Revolutionary days. It sets the seal of the period upon any home in which it is desired to embody the beautiful simplicity of the characteristics of this particular era.

The designs are those which by their grace and convenience were popular in the day in which they were created. We have avoided those which were freakish or the work of inartistic smiths, adopting the shapes and sizes which not only met with favor in their time, but are in consonance with modern ideas of fitness.

Each piece is made individually from heated iron by hammer on anvil. No drops or dies are employed. There will be found slight variations in form and size due to the method of manufacture, relieving the outline from the monotony of exact duplication. The ends of the handles are thinned by the spread of the metal under the hammer, just as when they were first made.

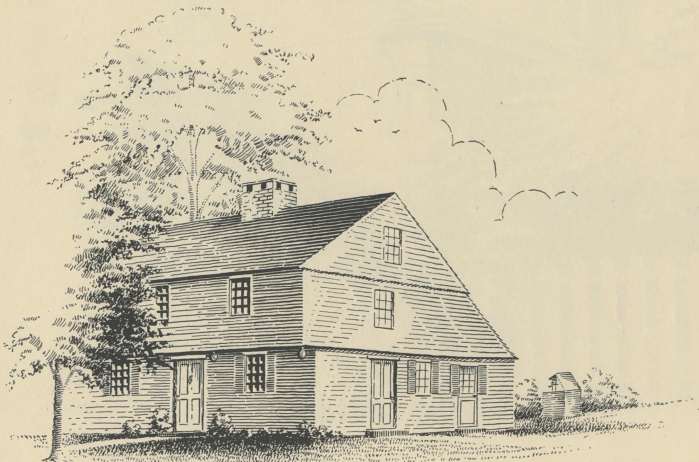
Two finishes are provided: DD, or dead black; HD, or half polished. Either finish can be supplied on all articles except No. 3988 garage bolt, No. 3 garage door holder and No. 200 garage lock, which are made in DD, or dead black finish only. Each piece is subjected to a rust-proofing process.
