Dear Mr. /Ms. Daylan Childress:

One or more of your school's Texas Workforce Commission (TWC)–approved programs have not met the required 60 percent minimum employment rate for graduates in jobs related to the field they were trained for by the program.

As set forth in this notice and as required by TWC Career Schools and Colleges rules at 40 Texas Administrative Code §807.131(b)(2) and §807.284(d), for each program that did not meet the 60 percent minimum employment rate for Fiscal Year 2013 (FY'13), the following corrective actions must be taken:

- **First time this year**—Prepare a performance improvement plan (PIP) indicating how the school is strengthening the program to improve educational success and employment outcomes, and submit to TWC within 30 days of the date of this letter.
- **Second consecutive year**—Reexamine and revise last year's PIP indicating how the school is increasing efforts to improve educational success and employment outcomes, and submit to TWC within 30 days of the date of this letter.

Complete Form PS-075 for each PIP and reference all efforts being used to bring the employment rate for graduates up to the required 60 percent minimum. Additionally, Form PS-076 provides a checklist for school use and record keeping (do not submit to TWC) when preparing the PIP. - **Second consecutive year, without improving by at least 50 percent of the difference between the 60 percent minimum employment rate and the program's employment rate in FY'12 (September 1, 2011–August 31, 2012)**—In addition to submitting a revised PIP, the program is subject to suspension of new enrollment of students funded by Local Workforce Development Board–allocated funds. Enrollment suspension is effective 20 days from the date of this letter.
- **Third consecutive year**—Notice of TWC's intent to revoke approval of the program. The school must suspend all new student enrollments and complete training of the program's current students. Revocation of approval and enrollment suspension is effective 20 days from the date of this letter. At that time, you will receive a Notice of Revocation for the program, whereupon the revocation can be appealed. The enrollment suspension cannot be appealed.

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
