

FARM AT BRAINTREE YIELDS 500 GALLONS

Federal Agents Find Stills, Arrest Boston Pair

BRAINTREE, Jan 21—Federal officers and Chief of Police Gallivan visited the old Santuosso farm off Granite st this afternoon and found a still, 500 gallons of redistilled alcohol and a large quantity of mash.

The outfit was destroyed and the police arrested two men found on the place. They gave their names as John Costa of 42 Chelsea st. Boston, and Pasquale Squela of 32 Charter st, Boston.

Says He Stole Dictionary to Compete in Delcevere King Contest

Yesterday he was sentenced to the House of Correction by Justice Sullivan, before whom he was arraigned in the Municipal Court.

Special officers Hartigan and Mullen of the LaGrange-st Station and Joseph Morrissey of the Stores Mutual Protective Association, were the complainants. They charged Allen with the larceny of the dictionary and a scarf to the total value of about \$12.

When Allen was asked what his business was he said, "I'm the 'boot.'" "What's the boot?" asked the court, and the defendant answered, "Why, the hip." "Well, what's the 'hip'?" insisted the court, and Allen replied, "Why, the fellow with the bottle on his hip."
