


### Middle School Transition Study


#### **Goal Statement**

To continue high quality educational programming and maintain continuity of academic instruction for ALL students with the least amount of disruption to students, staff, teachers, and parents during the three year transition period.




## Studied the Options With a Systematic Process:

- > Started with the Goal
- ➤ Generated Possible Alternatives
- > Evaluated Pros and Cons
- > Selected the Best Options
- > Final Recommendation



## Considerations in a Complex Issue – What are the Trade-Offs in making the decision?


- ➤ Course Scheduling maintaining a "teaming" concept for Middle School which has proven highly successful in steady academic progress and growth
- > Ensuring MS students are prepared for High School
- > Special needs programs for students
- ➤ Transportation/traffic congestion/start and end times
- ➤ Developmentally age-appropriate transitions (6<sup>th</sup> grade)
- Adequate space for specials, library, technology, gym and lunch
- Parking for staff and parents/community
- ➤ After school activities/clubs and sports
- ➤ Continuity for the three years during construction



#### **Superintendent Recommendation**


Relocate current Middle School staff and students to the vacant St. Richard's School building for the 3-year transition period.





# Recommendation Supports the Goal

- > Focus on what is "Best for Students"
- > Reasonable solution to a complex issue
- ➤ Least amount of programming disruption during construction period



#### Advantages of St. Richard's School Option


- Involves relocating only one building of students and staff for moving and resuming instruction in new location
- Eliminates disruption/change in the High School programming and campus operations
- ➤ Maintains established Middle School culture during time of transition
- ➤ Allows for continuation of Middle School programming that has proven successful for students

Continuity of current MS Concept/Teaming


Programming continues without interruption

Three year compromise of current programming




# Special Education Programming



Special education programming *maintained*, including intervention structure due to *adequate* amount of teaching and support spaces



Special education programming *minimized*, including intervention structure due to *inadequate* amount of teaching and support spaces



## **Functional Space**




Offers more space than the High School

Requires 4 modular units to accommodate all programming



Requires 8-10 modular units to operate the Middle School current programming



#### Lunchroom/Food Service





Lunch schedules remain the same


Food brought in by Central Kitchen


Involves mixing students – grades 7-12

## Transportation/Traffic




Improved traffic flow for busses Bus routes maintained, not changed




Traffic would be highly congested - both Revere and Burns

RTA bus service will be impacted by need to accommodate 24 additional busses




#### **Athletics**




Provides practice spaces for programs, *except* football and track (alternative locations already identified)



All athletes will be required to use practice facilities later in the evening or very early before school based on availability




#### Clubs/Activities




Clubs and activities continue at current levels

Space will be an issue for both High School and Middle School intramurals

Movement of meeting times based on space availability may reduce participation




## Impact on Start/End Times




No change to start and end times due to relocation

Requires change to *both* High School and Middle School start and end times

Likely impacts transportation schedules throughout district



## Impact on District




Will not impact operations in any other buildings in the district


Will disrupt the learning of the Middle School


Some elective classes at the High School will be reduced due to limited teaching spaces

Increase in study hall sizes due to fewer available classroom spaces









## Summary of Advantages




- Continuity of current MS Concept/Teaming/ Programming supporting proven success and student growth
  - Adequate available teaching spaces allows for continuation of special education programming and supports
- ➤ Requires fewer modular units than High School
- Lunch schedules maintained
- Parking adequate for needs
- ➤ Improved traffic flow for busses
- Available practice spaces for teams
- > Clubs and activities continue at current levels
- No change to start and end times due to relocation
- Will not impact operations in any other buildings in the district
- Already anticipated by the community













































































