Amendment V	Amendment V will lower the age of eligibility to serve in the Colorado General Assembly from 25 to 21, opening up government to participation by the next generation.	YES
Amendment W	A measure to simplify the ballot question language for judicial retention elections.	YES
Amendment X	A fix for the state constitution giving lawmakers the ability to properly regulate industrial hemp now that marijuana is legal.	YES
Amendment Y	A measure to create a nonpartisan Independent Commission to conduct congressional redistricting.	YES
Amendment Z	Companion measure to Amendment Y, creating a nonpartisan Independent Commission to conduct state legislative reapportionment.	YES
Amendment A	The Colorado Constitution contains an exception for the legalization of slavery. Vote 'Yes' to remove this shameful language from our constitution.	YES
Amendment 73	Raises revenue for Colorado's P-12 public schools via a modest tax increase on the top 2% of incomes in Colorado and big corporations.	YES
Amendment 74	A radical measure to create massive taxpayer payoffs to special interests and developers opposed by Republicans, Democrats, and local governments.	NO
Amendment 75	A hypocritical "sneak attack" on Colorado's campaign finance laws by supporters of President Trump.	NO
Proposition 109	A deceptive measure to "fix roads" by forcing lawmakers to make painful cuts to every other part of the budget in order to pay off billions in new debt.	NO
Proposition 110	A bipartisan plan to address the state's \$9 billion transportation backlog via a small sales tax increase. Don't get it twisted, vote FOR 110 and AGAINST 109.	YES
Proposition 111	A measure to put an end to predatory payday loans in Colorado once and for all. An exception in the state's usury law currently allows 200% effective interest.	YES
Proposition 112	Requires a larger distance between new oil and gas drilling and neighborhoods. Does NOT "ban fracking" or affect existing operations.	YES

You may register to vote in Colorado at any time up to and including Election Day.
