10 Steps to bring the movie "I'm Not Ashamed" To Your City/Community

The following is the process to bring "I'm Not Ashamed" to a city that is not scheduled for the initial opening weekend.

- 1. Secure a commitment of \$5,000 in ticket sales for the market. This offer will be made available to full price ticket theaters only.
- 2. Define the first and second theater of choice along with preferred dates and times of theater buyout showings.
- 3. Enlist your City Contact person who will provide the name and address of each theater to PureFlix.
- 4. Send an email to Ashley Kelly at <u>Ashley.kelly@pureflix.com</u> defining the commitment and the theater information.
- 5. PureFlix Booking and Distribution will secure the theater commitment.
- 6. Ashley Kelly will notify your City Contact of theater commitment.
- 7. City Contact will send the \$5,000 to be paid through the INA Group Payment Portal: payment.pureflixalliance.com/product/notashamedgrouptickets
- 8. Upon receipt of the payment, PureFlix Booking and Distribution will book and pay for the theater(s) buyout(s) for dates and show times.
- 9. Ashley Kelly will notify City Contact of purchase of the theater(s) buyout(s) for dates and show times.
- 10. The City Contact will be responsible for going to the theater and receiving the tickets for the theater(s) buyout(s) for dates and show times.
