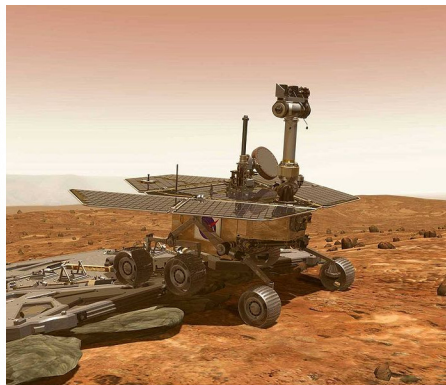
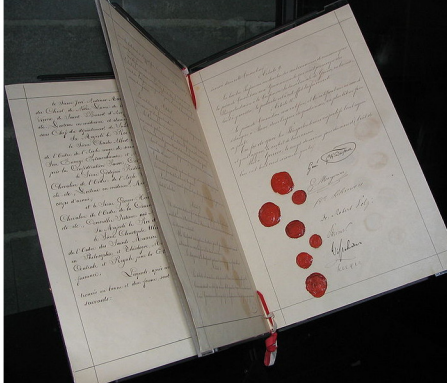

1 (2013)	At least 60 people are killed and 200 injured in a stampede after celebrations at Félix Houphouët-Boigny Stadium in Abidjan, Ivory Coast.
5 (2009)	66 people die in a nightclub fire in Bangkok, Thailand.
10 (2004)	In a vote of confidence, General Pervez Musharraf wins 658 out of 1,170 votes in the Electoral College of Pakistan, and according to Article 41(8) of the Constitution of Pakistan, is “deemed to be elected” to the office of President until October 2007.
20 (1994)	The Zapatista Army of National Liberation initiates twelve days of armed conflict in the Mexican State of Chiapas.  The North American Free Trade Agreement comes into effect.
25 (1989)	The Montreal Protocol Protocol on Substances That Deplete the Ozone Layer comes into force.
30 (1984)	The original American Telephone & Telegraph Company is divested of its 22 Bell System companies as a result of the settlement of the 1974 United States Department of Justice antitrust suit against AT&T.  Brunei becomes independent of the United Kingdom.
50 (1964)	The Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland is divided into the independent republics of Zambia and Malawi, and the British-controlled Rhodesia.
60 (1954)	NBC makes the first coast-to-coast NTSC color broadcast when it telecast the Tournament of Roses Parade, with public demonstrations given across the United States on prototype color receivers.
75 (1939)	Sydney, Australia, swelters in 45 °C (113 °F) heat, a record for the city.
