
SANSA KROMA is a song commonly sung on playgrounds in Ghana in Akan language. Most children in West Africa will be familiar with it.

This game song can be sung in groups or as a call & response song. The lyrics describe that “a young chick is chased around by a hawk (Sansa) but it saved and protected by her friends. Such songs send the message to children that they will not be abandoned and will always be protected.



# Bebe Moke


Song from Congo



Be - be mo - ke, na - ni a - be - ti yo,



Bebe Moke translates to “Baby so Small” and is a traditional song originating from Zaire that is sung to small children and babies. It is sung by parents to reassure the small children.
