Emergency Card Examples for Medical Cautions and Alerts

Combined Caution - All when used will look something like this:

Allergy - Bee Sting: [x]
Allergy - Food: [x]
Allergy - Pollen/dust/hay Fever: [x]
Medication Needed At School: [x]
Medication Taken At Home: [x]
Migraine Headaches: [x]
Other: Allergic to cheese and chocolate

*This option, will respect formatting options such as *Preserve Line Break*, to create a list. This must be applied within the Inspector or Formatting tools to apply. By default, it will be a listed.

Combined Caution - All (Block) when used will look something like this:

Allergy - Bee Sting; Allergy - Food; Allergy - Pollen/dust/hay Fever; Medication Needed At School; Medication Taken At Home; Migraine Headaches; Other: Allergic to cheese and chocolate;

*This option removes the [x] from *Combined Caution - All* and creates a colon separated list of all cautions applicable to the child. This will NOT respect additional formatting such as breaks, but by default act similar to a comma separated list.

Emergency Card Examples for Medical Cautions and Alerts

Caution - [Name of Caution] when used will look something like this:

x

*This option is perfect for Emergency Cards that have an area where all cautions or alerts are listed, and an X is mapped to print and display an X when and if applicable.

Combined Caution - [Name of Caution] when used will look something like this:

Allergy - Bee Sting: [x]

*This option when used will colon separate all information to the specific caution or alert, including notes, custom fields, and any additional information documented for the specific caution or alert.
