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Corona Virus Student Handbook Supplement

1. Teachers must complete a self-check for wellness and temperature.
2. Teachers will have face masks or face shield available when teaching close to students.
3. Bus students will social distance as space permits.
4. Students 6th grade and up must wear a mask *while riding the bus* and *during passing periods*.
5. Teachers will be provided with hand sanitizer for classrooms.
 - a. Unless hands are visibly soiled, ***an alcohol-based hand rub is preferred over soap and water in most clinical situations and by the CDC due to evidence of better compliance compared to soap and water.*** Hand rubs are generally less irritating to hands and are effective in the absence of a sink.
 - b. Hands should be washed with soap and water for at least 20 seconds when visibly soiled, before and after eating, after PE/Athletics, and after using the restroom.
 - c. Staff and students should cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue. Used tissues should be thrown in the trash and hands washed immediately with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If no tissues are available, please cough into your elbow.
 - i. If soap and water are not readily available, hand sanitizer can be used (for staff and older children who can safely use hand sanitizer).
6. All visitors must wear a mask and stay within entry.
 - a. **Visitors will not be permitted** in the hallways, classrooms, cafeteria, gym, auditorium, etc., during regular school hours at this time.
 - b. If a parent or other visitor needs to schedule a conference with a teacher, they may contact the school office and arrange a meeting during staff conference periods.
7. Breakfast and lunch will be normal and at risk. Students will sit one space apart at tables.
 - a. Breakfast 1: 6-12th – 7:20-7:40 AM
 - b. Breakfast 2: PK-5th – 7:40-8:00 AM
 - c. Lunch 1: PK-5th – 10:40-11:10 AM
 - d. Lunch 2: 6-8th – 11:15-11:45 AM
 - e. Lunch 3: 9-12th – 12:06-12:36 PM
8. Athletics will be normal and at risk. Wear mask on bus trips if corona virus is still a problem.
9. Sick students will be sent to office. If fever is present (100.4°F), student will be sent home and must remain home that day and the next day. If fever is present on the second day, testing is recommended. If fever is present on the 3rd day, testing is required and a release note from doctors required before returning to school. On-line instruction will be available.
10. A student testing positive will notify the school and the school of the positive test. The school will in turn notify parents of students that share classes with the positive student that a student has tested positive. Parents will react by sending students to school the next day or choose on-line learning. If parents choose for their child to undertake distance learning the school must be notified.
11. If a teacher should become ill, or should test positive with no symptoms, the instruction should continue live from home (a substitute/aide/teacher on break will be made available to supervise the classroom). If the teacher is too sick to teach from home pre-recorded lessons will be utilized for class instruction.
