District Wellness Meeting Minutes
January 24, 2017

Welcome – Jennifer Biddle

Flu clinic update – Ann Stephens – The flu clinic was a success with the following vaccinations given: 75 at Walker; 56 at Kindergarten Center/East; 396 at Central; 331 at MJHS; and 223 at MHS. A total of 1,594 vaccines including staff were given. This is consistent with previous years. She said even though it is a lot of work, she hopes that it continues.

School Based Health Center grant update – Sonya Corbell – one committee meeting has been held. Several committee members will attend a mandatory meeting in Little Rock on Monday, January 30th to find out more information about the grant process. She stated that there was a need for care for our students because there are kids with a lot of health care needs. The parent will be responsible for enrolling the student. She will provide an update at the next wellness meeting, but the grant is for 5 years, and the district will have to sustain after that. Mr. Ward will provide a meeting with providers. Some of the services that she hopes to have offered are physical health, dental, mental health and vision. These services will also be available to the staff.

Offer vs. Serve from Susan Gosdin - There are more choices in each cafeteria this year. Everyone is still adjusting to the new program, but overall the students and staff are still excited about the new options available. The second grade at East Side Elementary is having a hard time getting through the lines in a timely manner due the size of the class. Cashiers are not as fast as they can be because every tray must be reimbursable. Susan provided a power point from Child Nutrition that provided information about specific nutrition standards, federal regulations, offering choices, meeting all the guidelines, etc. She said she has not seen an increase in cost savings and the minimizing of food waste yet. The committee took a quiz to determine if a meal had all the required components. The average score was 50%.

The committee discussed concerns. Kristal McDonald, an Assistant Principal at East Side Elementary, said that she wanted the students at East Side to get their recess time. She said that lunch is taking longer this year for the second grade because of the choice addition and the class size.

The committee reviewed past school menus. Susan said to let her know of any items that students do not like. Kristal McDonald said the breakfast for lunch meal is not very popular at East Side Elementary.

Susan asked the committee if anyone had any additional comments or concerns.

Coach Ford expressed concern about improving the cafeteria facilities to accommodate all students in a timely manner. He mentioned adding additional serving lines.

Susan said that bus safety may be a topic for the next meeting.

Susan asked committee members to email her if they thought of anything after the meeting or had agenda items for the next meeting.
