Welcome – Jennifer Biddle, Chairperson

- 1) K-12 Consultant, Sharla Mills, presented the new menu and procedures differing from prior Years. The salad bar has been a big adjustment for staff and students. Concern for speed in serving lunch was noted by elementary principals, Jill Rader and Angie Water. Recommendation of separation of students by main item choice would increase serving speed. Student counts for main dish request are to be taken daily at East Side and Central. This would help to prepare the correct number of serving of each main dish and reduce waste and unhappy students. Central, MJHS, and MHS are selecting lots of items from salad bar. Younger students are not always eating what they take. The number of meals district wide has increased. Students and parents have made positive comments about the new presentation of meal.
- 2) Menus for August and September were reviewed.
- 3) Tracy Woolfley, MHS Medical Professions Instructor - Health clinics to be held this year.
- 4) Jennifer Biddle, East Side Nurse, reviewed the allergy substitutions and documentation requirements. Students with allergies are loaded in to point of sale system to notify cashiers of students as they proceed through line. Carb counts by item are sent to the nurses weekly for students with insulin injections.
- 5) Leslie Mayo, Federal Program Coordinator, distributed ASCIP plan for discussion.
- 6) Campus leaders discussed the parent involvement and visitation numbers was discussed. Elementary schools are have more parent involvement during school hours than secondary. Campus events are supported by parents at all levels.
