

Return to School Update

On Monday, August 17, Atlanta Independent School District will welcome more than 1,800 students and their families back to school - whether in person or virtually. Our staff has been working throughout the summer months to ready our campuses through extra safety precautions and with a strong instructional model for on-site learners as well as a much improved, robust instructional model for our virtual learners.

Per Texas Education Agency guidelines, parents/guardians will be asked to commit to either On-Campus or At-Home Remote Learning by completing a Commitment Form for each student, which will be mailed to the student's home address on file. If AISD is required to close again for an extended period of time, all students will transition to online learning.

Atlanta ISD Instructional Options

AISD is required to offer two (2) educational options for the 2020-21 school year:

✓ **TRADITIONAL ON-CAMPUS LEARNING**

In-person learning on campus, with heightened hygiene and disinfecting protocols.

✓ **AT-HOME REMOTE LEARNING**

Full-time learning opportunities which occur virtually from home and not on a AISD campus. Curriculum and resources provided by an AISD teacher will be specifically designed for a virtual environment and aligned to district expectations/scope and sequence of curriculum. At-Home Remote Learners will be required to participate in class and demonstrate progress on a daily basis. If a student does not participate daily, they will be marked absent and could lose credit for the class. At-Home Remote Learning will be a full course load of instruction and assignments that is comparable to what students who are attending school in person will be required to complete. At the secondary level, some elective courses may be limited. UIL sanctioned activities will not be available for At-Home Remote Learners.
