DAC - District Advisory Committee

Our District Advisory Committee is made up of 42 parents who represent our elementary, intermediate, high school, and alternative schools. Parents from each one of our 42 campuses elect a representative to serve on our District Advisory Committee.

DAC- By law and according to Title I Part A, every school receiving money under Title I (Bilingual Education, Migrant Services, Special Education, Gifted and Talented, etc.) must have an advisory council. The members of this advisory council will act as a group, not individually, and shall have the responsibility for advising the school district in the planning, implementation and evaluation of the Title I Programs. It is important to understand that not every recommendation can be accepted nor acted upon. The District Advisory Committee Council will meet as necessary, at least three times a year.

Purpose of the Committee

- To provide input, plan and evaluate Title I Programs
- To advise and provide feedback regarding special education programs, policy implementation, and academic goals
- To serve as sounding board regarding program activities
- To form a partnership with the Family and Community Engagement Staff
- To provide support for Social Workers, Parent Educators, and District Parents
