Homecoming Guest Speaker Chief Warrant Officer five Richard Tiu

Blackwell High School was proud to welcome home Chief Warrant Officer five Richard Tiu, Class of 1996, as the Master of Ceremonies for the Homecoming Assembly. He is the son of Kerry and Linda Wood of Blackwell, and attended Blackwell Public Schools since second grade. While at BHS, he lettered in Track and Football.

After high school, Officer Tiu entered the U.S. Army in October 1997 and enlisted as the Petroleum Supply Specialist. In August of 2004, he was accepted into the Army Warrant Officer Program as a Rotor-Wing Aviator (a Blackhawk Pilot) and later transferred to become an Unmanned Aircraft System Technician.

Chief Warrant Officer five Richard Tiu has completed the highest primary military education and attended Columbia Southern University to earn a Bachelor's Degree in Occupational Safety and Health, and at Central Texas College he completed a degree in General Studies.

Chief Warrant Officer five Richard Tiu has been deployed once to the Multi-National Force, Observation, Sinai, Egypt, and once to operation Enduring Freedom, Afghanistan; He was deployed three (3) times to Operation Iraqi Freedom, Iraq.

Officer Tiu is currently stationed in Hawaii with his family at the U.S. Army Pacific Command, managing all Unmanned Aircraft System activity in the Pacific area of responsibility.
