4th Grade Fun with Science

The Friday before Spring Break, the Fourth Grade students had the pleasure of getting to spend an hour with a presenter from WSU's "Fun with Science" program. This was the third time Mrs. Fisher from WSU traveled to the CIC to share with us how cool science can be and this time did not disappoint! Our topic was solids, liquids, gases, and the way the atoms move in all three states of matter, which we got to learn about through the use of liquid nitrogen. It was amazing to see things freeze, melt, and evaporate. Her first experiment was to fill a tea kettle full of liquid nitrogen and have us make observations. Everyone quickly noticed that the steam coming out was cold and the kettle was freezing but it was whistling, just like if it were on a stove! In another experiment, she poured the liquid nitrogen over a balloon which made it freeze and turn crinkly and crunchy like paper. For her last experiment, and our favorite, she used vanilla, heavy whipping cream, half and half, sugar, and the liquid nitrogen to make ice cream! It looked like a witch's brew and tasted delicious. This is a lesson we won't forget anytime soon!
