

Clearwater Driver Education 2018

Requirements to Enroll

1. Student **must** be 14 prior to January 1, 2018.
2. Student **must** have a instruction permit valid through July 1, 2018
3. Student and parent **must** attend information and enrollment meeting on Monday, March 12th at 6:30 pm at the high school commons area
4. **Enrollment form, fee (\$160.00) , and copy of valid instruction permit must be submitted on March 12, 2018.**
5. Student and parent **must** attend meeting on Monday, March 26, 2018 to set up students virtual classroom to complete enrollment.

General Information

Students must be available to drive between May 14 and June 15. We are unable to schedule around camps or vacations during that time. There will be some Saturday driving times available beginning in April, but they will not be required. The class work will be done through a virtual classroom. Students will be able to begin doing the work online after March 26 and must be completed before May 9.

ATTENDANCE Students must make an effort to participate in all assigned activities by the designated dates in order to demonstrate proper attendance. Students are also required to attend any face-to-face sessions scheduled per instructor or administrative decision. All course requirements must be completed prior to achieving course completion. Failure to complete the course will result in a failure of the course, and prohibition of participation in in-car instruction.

TESTING PROCEDURE Students are required to successfully complete each test at 80% competency. A failure to score at least 80% on online module exams will result in the student retaking the test. If the student does not achieve at least an 80%, they must retake the exam. There is a 24-hour waiting period to force study and review. If a student does not achieve at least 80% mastery on the second test, there will be one more attempt permitted, with the same 24-hour waiting period between each attempt. After the second failure, special assistance by the instructor will be arranged. If the student does not pass on the third attempt, they will be considered to have failed the exam and will be required to meet face-to-face or synchronously with an instructor to discuss continued enrollment. Additional attempts can be given at instructor discretion. A final test will be given face-to-face with a mastery of 80% to pass the curriculum. If a student fails the first final exam, a second test will be administered. If 80% is not completed, the student will fail the class, and will not be permitted to participate in in-car instruction.

TIME IN CAR Each behind the wheel objective will be successfully completed to the mastery level, at the discretion of the in-car instructor. Due to the timeframe of scheduling, the student will not meet the objectives if more than two (2) scheduled driving sessions are missed. A **minimum** of four (4) hours of in car instruction is needed to complete the behind the wheel course. Successful completion is determined when the student can consistently and correctly perform without instructor prompt the driving competency/task to the satisfaction of the instructor.
