These musicians will go to Wichita Falls on January 27th, to attend an all day clinic to prepare for a concert that evening. The next performance for our kids is our Christmas Concert on December 12th in the High School New Gym. It is a tradition here that our concerts are standing room only. Please bring your family and friends and fill that gym. Like I always say, these kids deserve to play for a packed house.

With that, comes the dress requirements. These are listed in the handbook every student received at the beginning of the year. I know it's been a long time since that was handed out. We talked about this with

Like the All-District Music, we use chamber (small groups) ensembles to expose the kids to other music they wouldn't play in a large group. This type of playing improves their listening and individual playing skills. We will start on this music in January and the festival is in February and will take place at Wichita Falls High School.

Like I told you at the beginning of the year, we have changed zones in our region. This change was made for the kids and parents alike. Unlike last year, we will be much closer to our contests. Both Solo and Ensemble as well as UIL Concert and Sight-reading will be held at Wichita Falls High School. This will cut down on travel time as give our parents the opportunity to attend these performances. I think you will agree that the travel to Stephenville was a bit long. We hope to see great attendance from our wonderful parents at both events. It's much better for the kids to play for an audience rather than just three judges and an empty auditorium. i hope to see you there.

Our 6th Graders will also be preparing for their contests when we get back from break. both events are in April. The first event is the Sandy Lake Fun-Fest. Just to put a bug in your ear, we will need parent chaperones riding the buses there and back as well as watching the kids while we are at the park and the mall. The more help we have, the better the trip and the safer our kids will be. This has been a good festival over the years for our 6th Grade Band. They will also have the opportunity to participate at the Decatur Solo and Ensemble the later part of April. I can't wait.
