## Classroom Preparation

### OSHA's Hazard Communication Requirements

Have you read the requirements of the Hazard Communication Standard (<http://www.osha.gov>) located in 29 CFR 1910.1200?

Does your company have a written hazard communication program?

Do you have a complete list of the hazardous chemicals located at your company?

Are material safety data sheets (MSDSs) organized and accessible for all employees?

### Preparing Handouts and Training Props

Print out and make copies of the Hazard Communication Quiz.

Bring a set of your MSDSs so employees can be taught how to find an MSDS.

Make copies of one or two MSDSs for chemicals that are widely used by your company. These can be used for discussion in the class.

Bring four or five different chemical containers for the label discussion.

Bring samples of personal protective equipment (PPE).

Bring copies of your company's evacuation plan or maps.
