Anderson County, Kansas

According to figures provided in the Kansas Statistical Abstract, the population of Anderson county was approximately 7827 in 2016. This represents a -3.39% change or net migration since the 2010 United States Census. With a total number of 579.6 square miles in the county, the population density for the county is 13.5 people per square mile. This places the county in the KDHE population peer group of a Rural area. According to projections reported in the Kansas Statistical Abstract, the percentage change in total population through the year 2040 is estimated at -10.55 for the county.

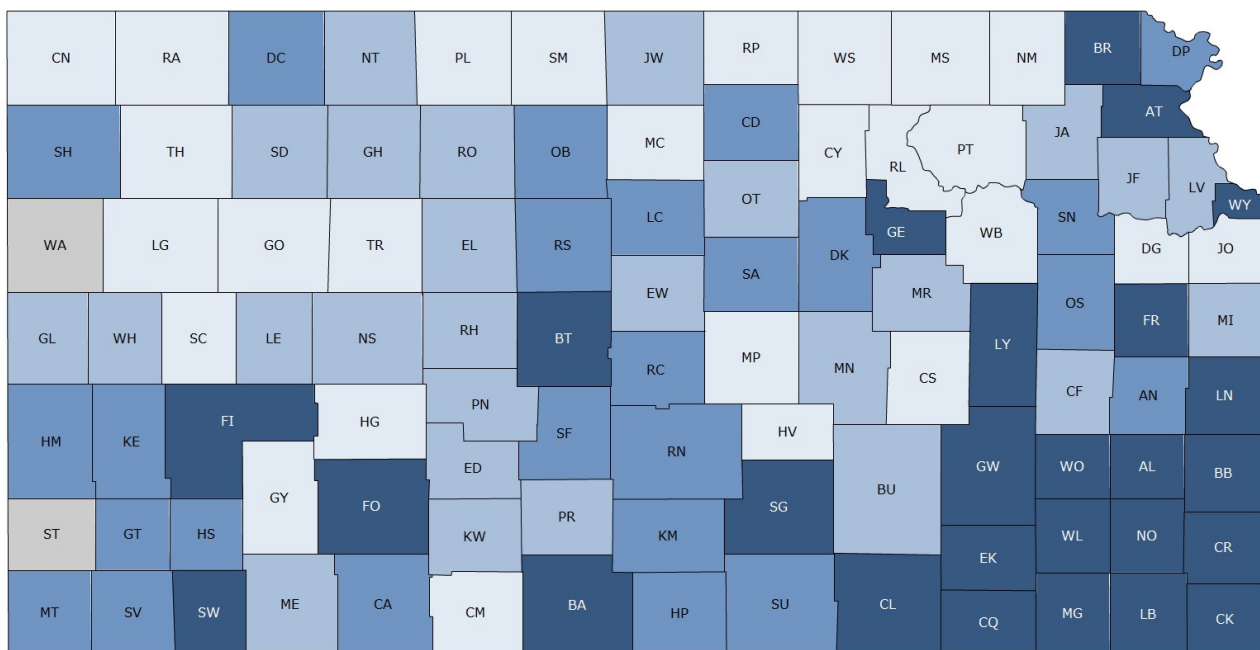
County Health Rankings:

The County Health Rankings (provided by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation) measure the health of nearly all counties in the nation and rank them within states. The Rankings are compiled using county-level measures from a variety of national and state data sources with 1 being the best.

The overall rankings in health factors represent what influences the health of a county. They are an estimate of the future health of counties as compared to other counties within a state. The ranks are based on four types of measures: health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic, and physical environment factors.

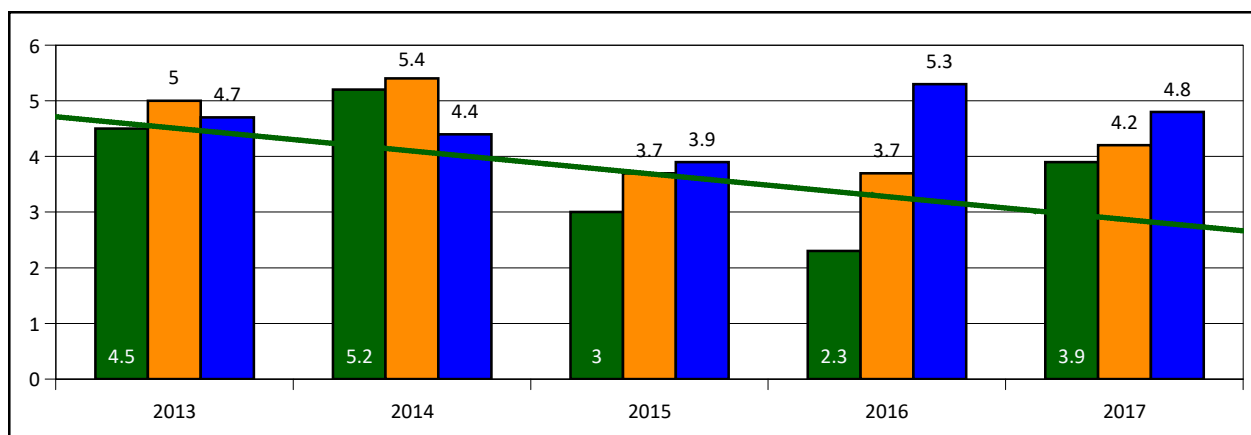

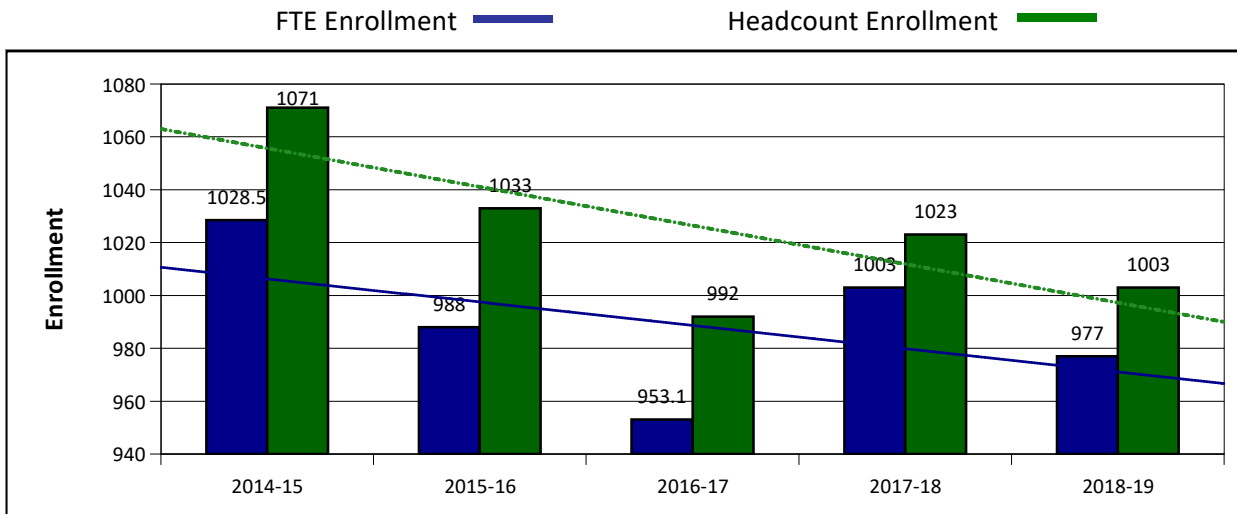

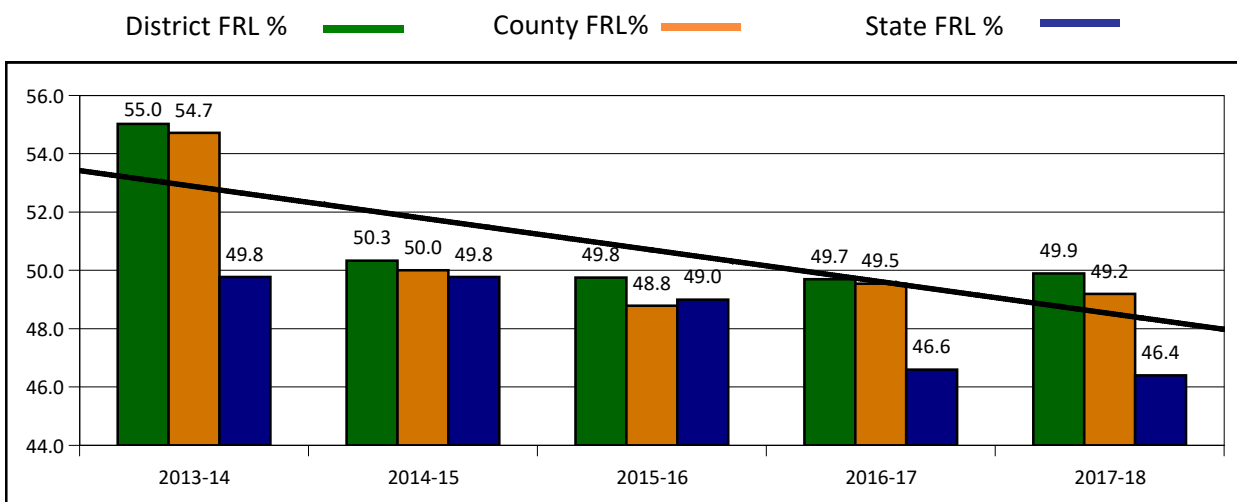

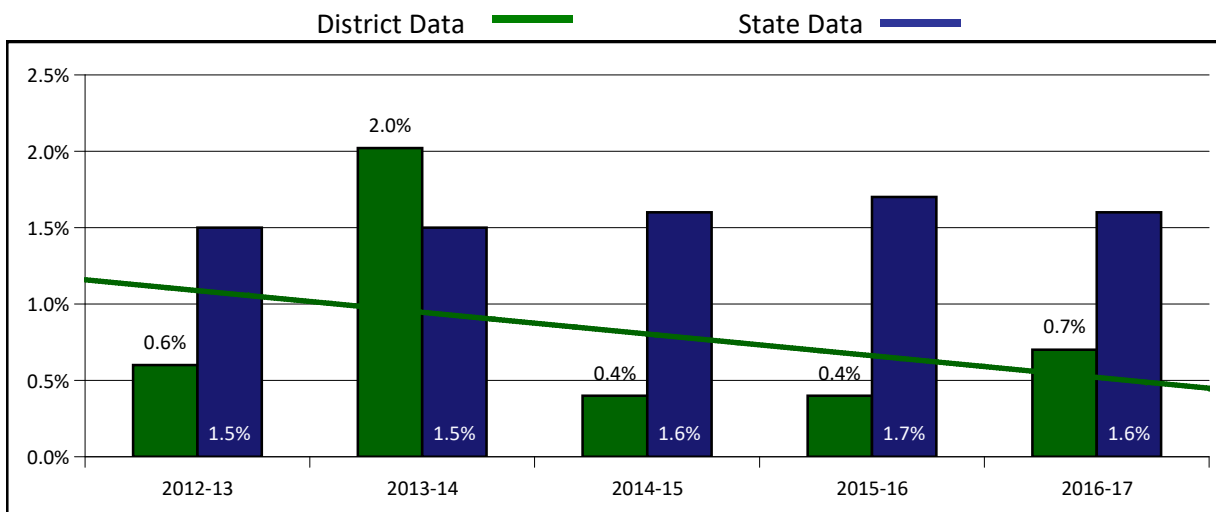

DROPOUT RATES (ALL STUDENTS):



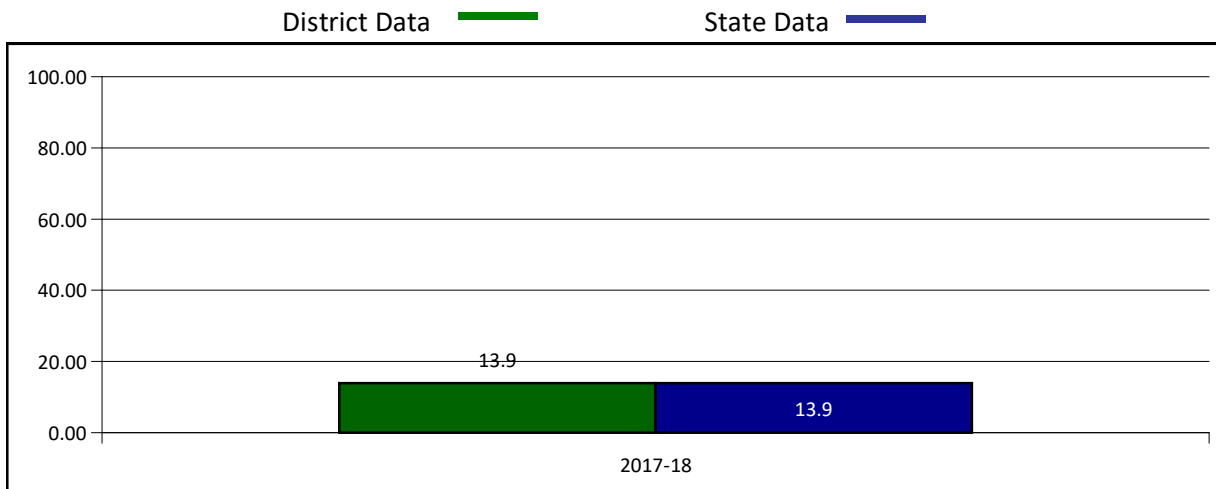

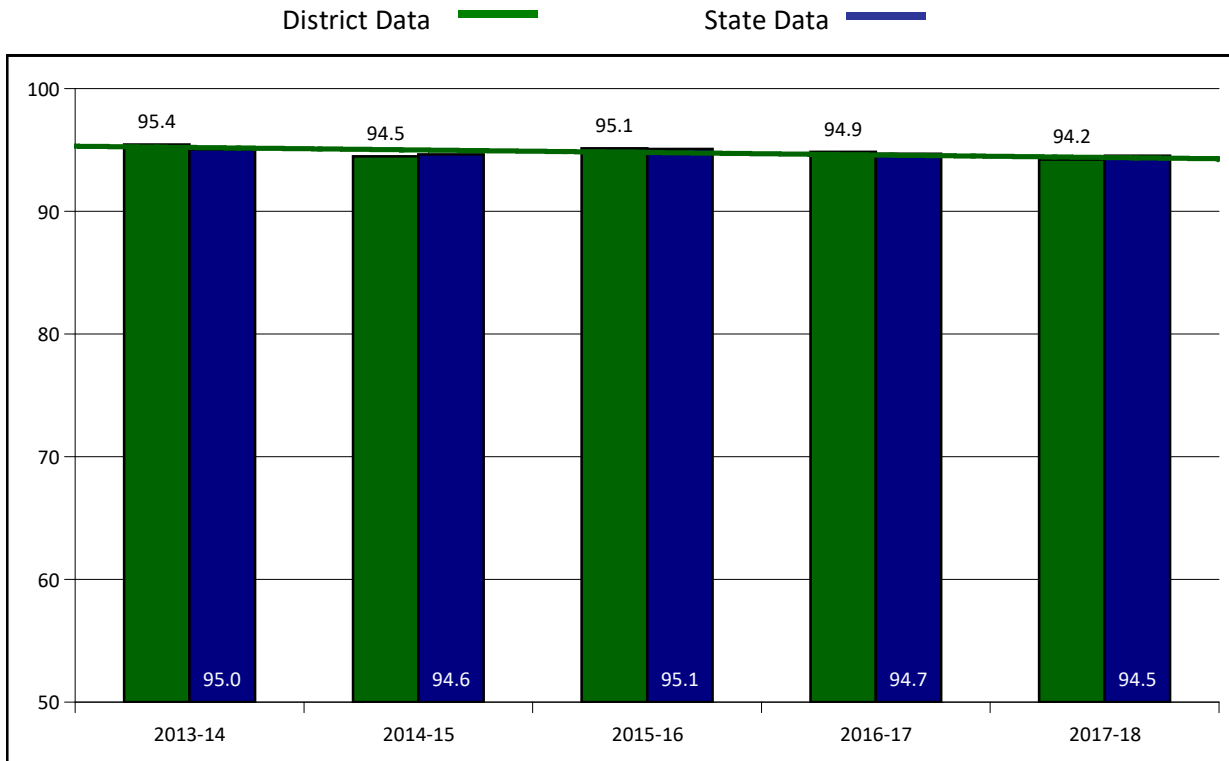

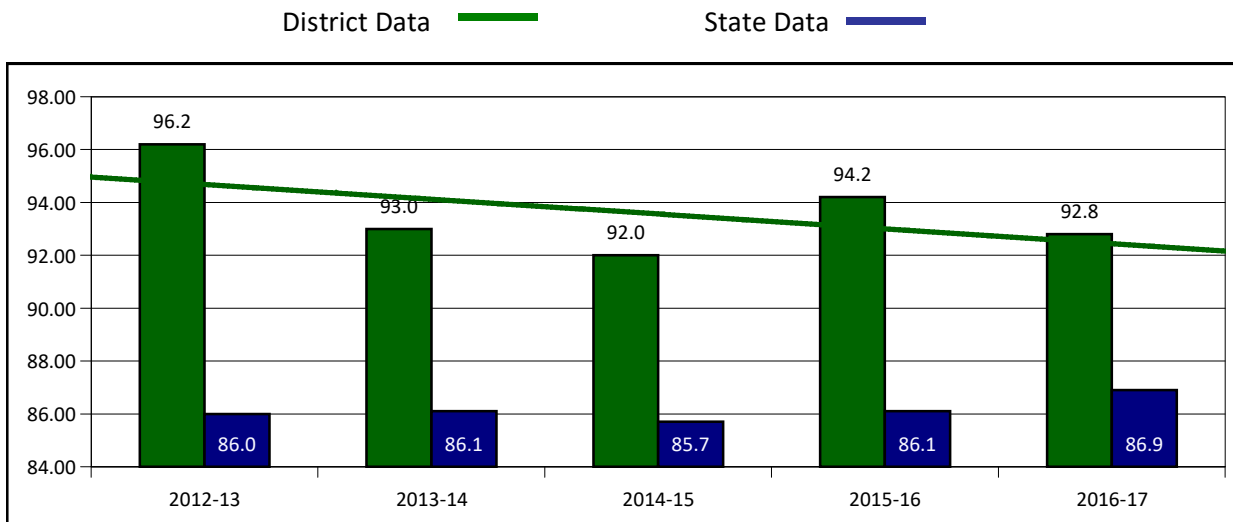

4-YEAR COHORT GRADUATION RATES (ALL STUDENTS):



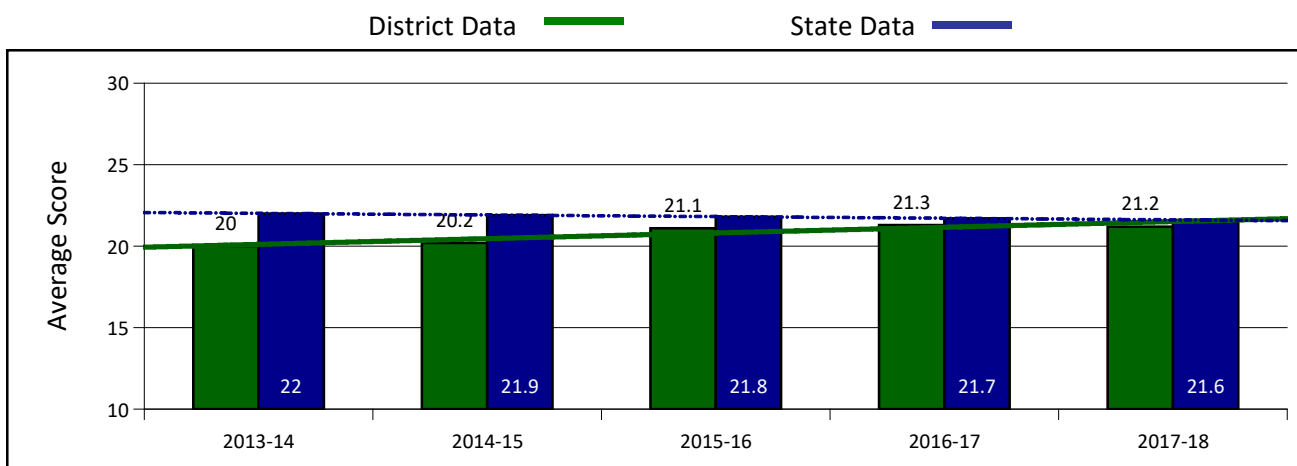

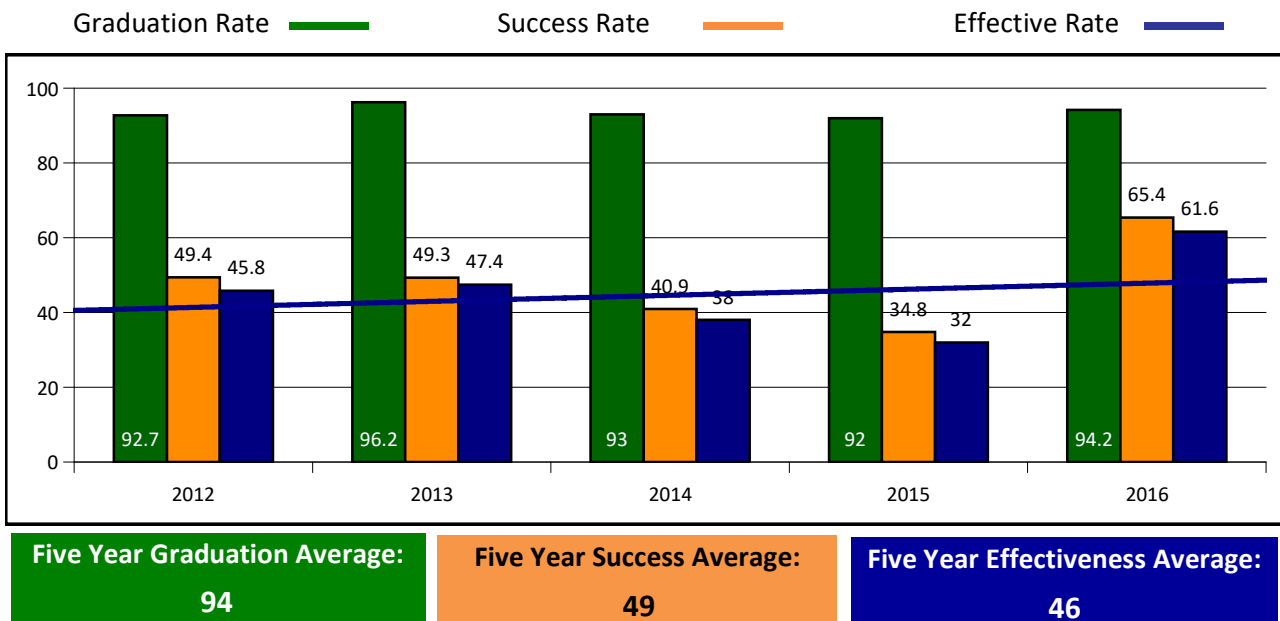
Graduation Rate:

The 4-year adjusted cohort graduation rate is the number of students who graduate in four years with a regular high school diploma divided by the number of students who entered high school as 9th graders four years earlier (adjusting for transfers in and out)

Success Rate: A student must meet one of four within two years of High School graduation

1. Student earned an Industry Recognized Certification while in High School
2. Student earned a Postsecondary Certificate
3. Student earned a Postsecondary Degree
4. Student enrolled in Postsecondary in both the first and second year following High School

Effective Rate: The calculated Graduation Rate multiplied by the calculated Success Rate.

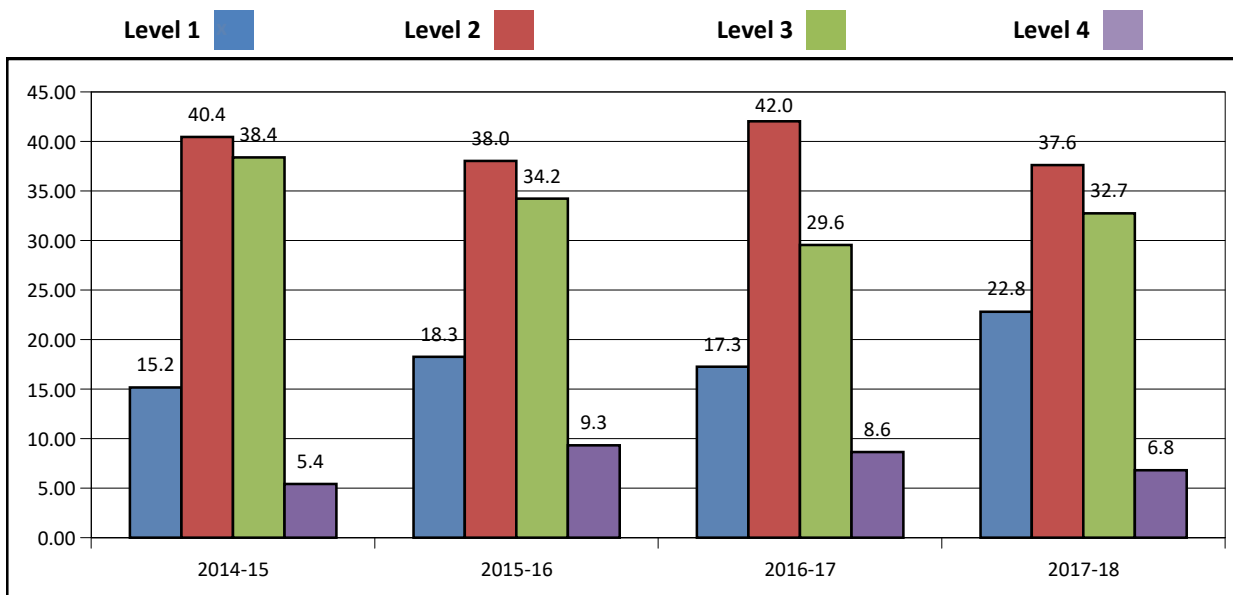

PERCENT BY SCORE LEVEL: ALL STUDENTS DISTRICT AVERAGE



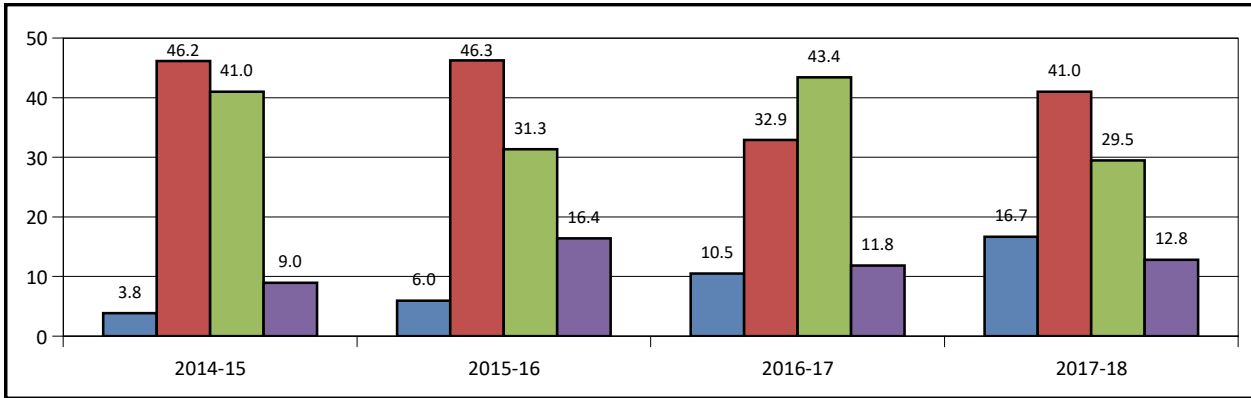

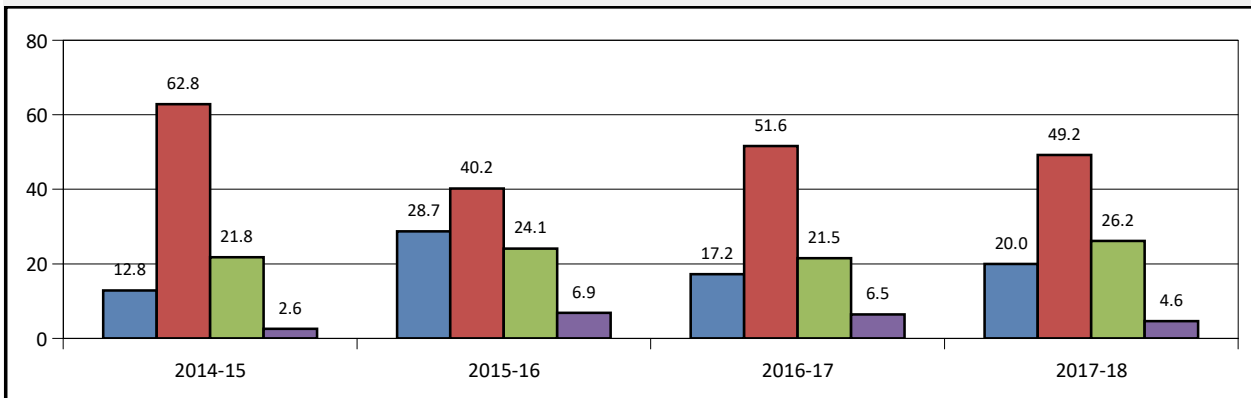

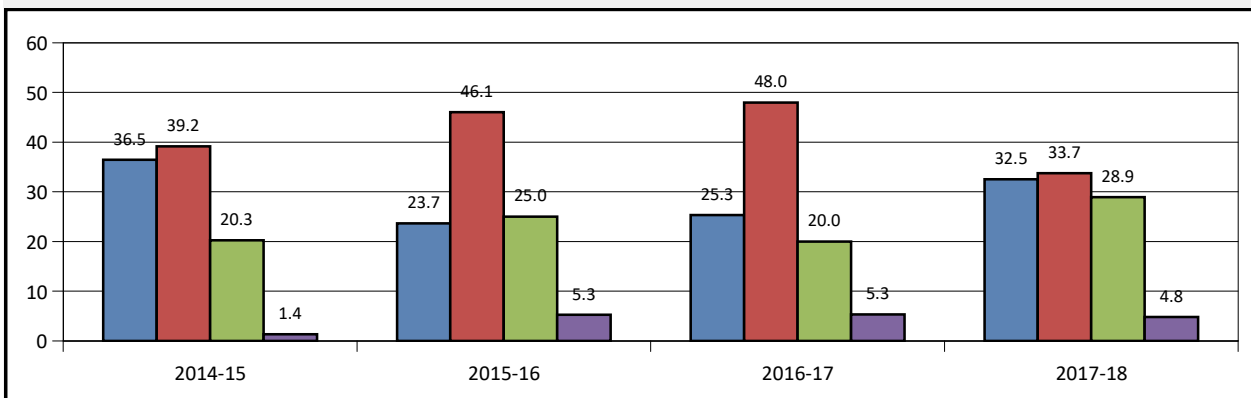

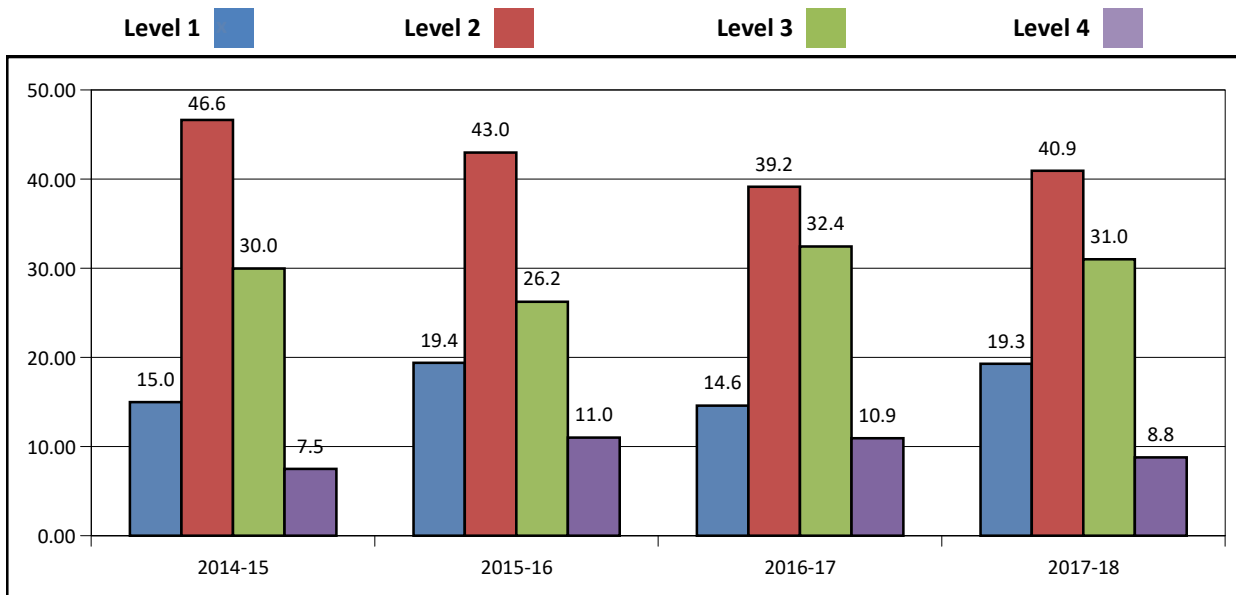

PERCENT BY SCORE LEVEL: ALL STUDENTS DISTRICT AVERAGE



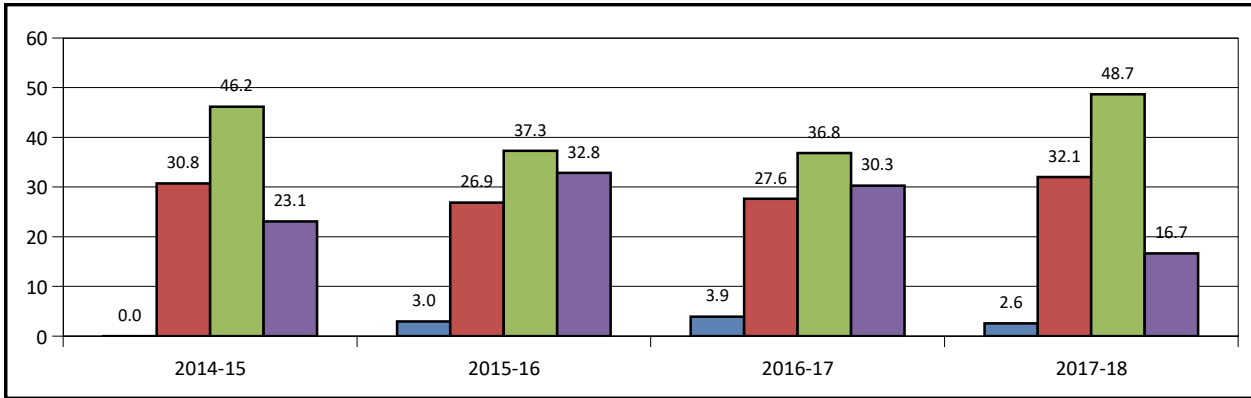

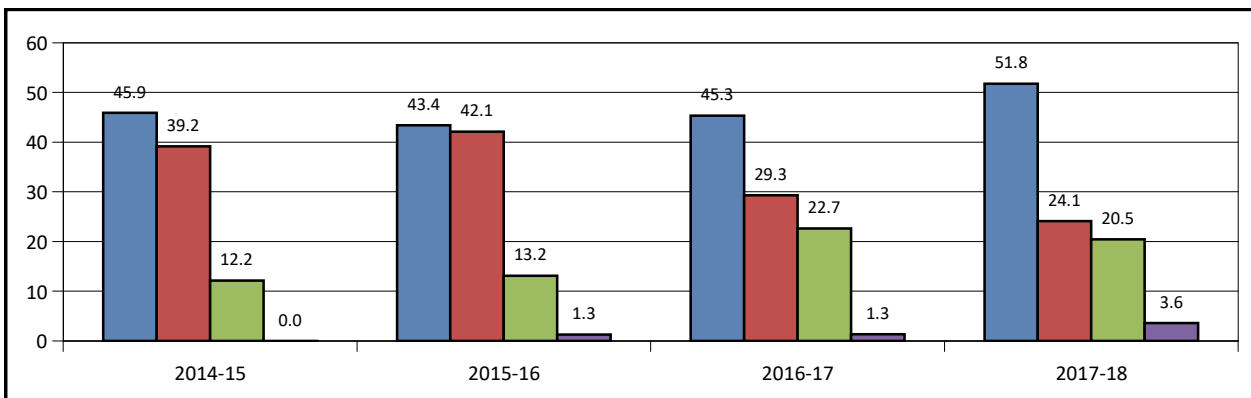
