

ESOL Programs

Sheltered English instruction-both English and academic content is taught.

ESL class period-English instruction and assistance in the regular academic classroom.

ESL pullout-student leaves the regular classroom to receive one-on-one/small group English instruction.

ESL push-in-ESL teacher comes into the regular classroom to give language assistance.

The assistance of bilingual paraprofessionals-to make the content more easily accessible.

Adaptations made by the regular academic classes-to make the content understandable.

The use of computer programs-to increase the student's English proficiency.

Sustained native language-taught primarily in the native language with gradual incorporation of English.

Early-exit bilingual-taught primarily in the native language and are mainstreamed into the English-only classroom within a year or two.

Two-way bilingual-students from a single language background are grouped in the same classroom.
