Each year the Education Oversight Board provides schools a report card to show the measures of school performance. Beginning this year, the Office of Educational Quality & Accountability has combined school and district reports into a newly redesigned School Profile. This report summarizes the strengths and weaknesses of schools in the State of Oklahoma. We use this information as an indicator of the quality of education being delivered to Thackerville Elementary students and to focus our efforts for the upcoming school year. With this letter you will find information about how Thackerville Elementary and Thackerville Public Schools compared to the state average in community characteristics, educational process, and student performance on state mandated assessments. It is important to note that this information is derived from data for the 2016-17 school year.

As you may remember, 2016-17 was the first school year that the Oklahoma Academic Standards were implemented in schools across the state. State Assessment scores across the state of Oklahoma were significantly lower for the 16-17 school year and are not comparable to previous years' scores.

We have focused on raising the standard for academics and increasing communication between school and home for the 2017-18 school year. We will continue to strive for excellence during the 2018-19 school year by meeting the diverse needs of our students through effective instruction, strategic intervention, technology and family involvement. Our team will be attending professional development throughout the summer to assist us in raising the bar at Thackerville Elementary.

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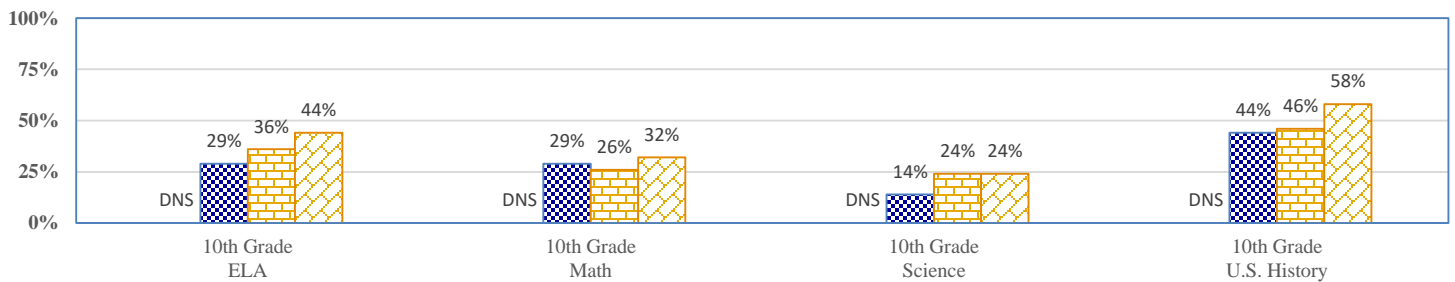

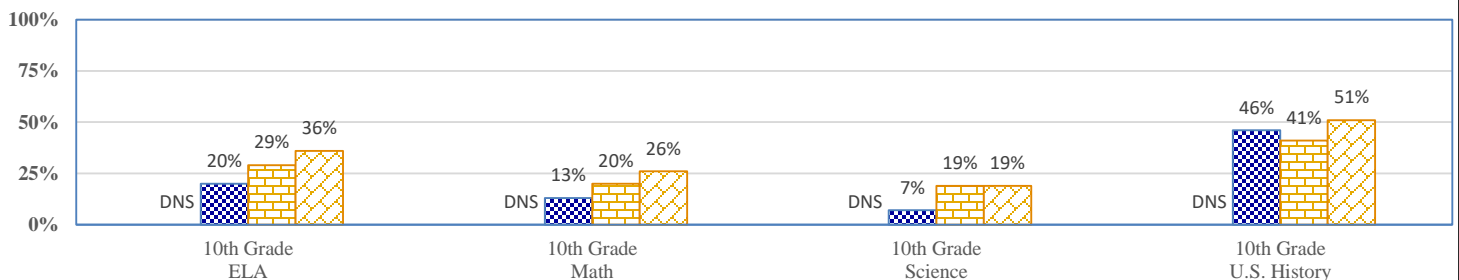
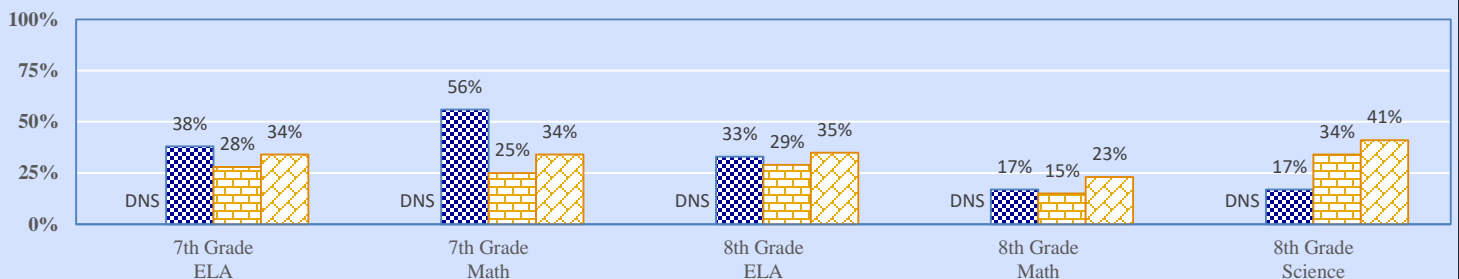
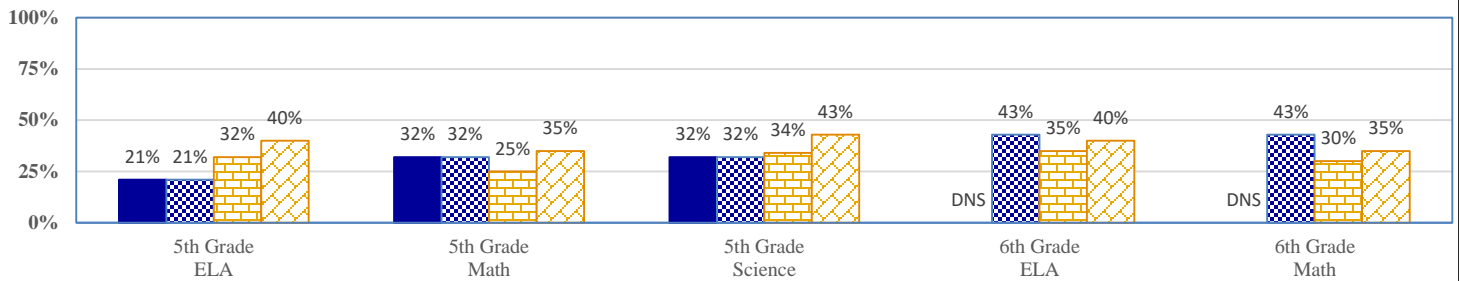
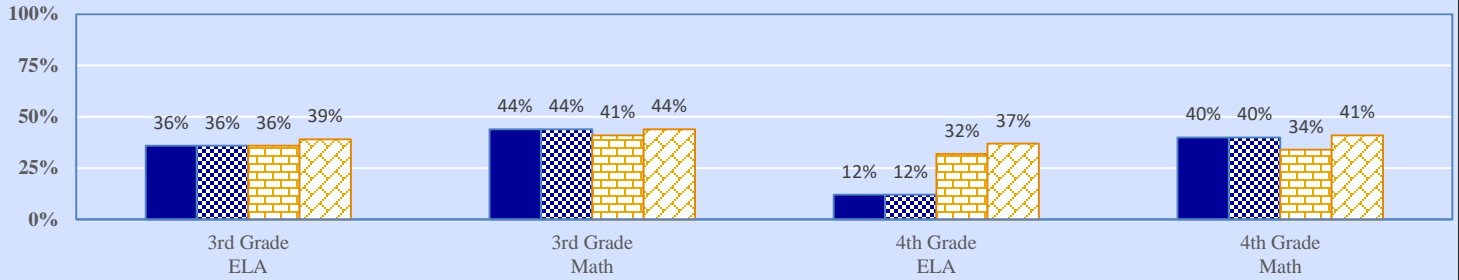
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2016-17 Student Performance (All Students)
