Agenda Item #2 – Texas Action for Healthy Kids "Advocating for School Health" ppt.

March 24, 2022 (Topic Lead by Lisa Edgar)

- PowerPoint presentation regarding Texas Action for Healthy Kids "Advocating for School Health". AFHK's mission is to mobilize family-school partnerships to prepare kids to be healthy in body and mind to achieve their vision: Healthy Kids. Better World. AFHK addresses the root causes of the child health crisis by ensuring that children, particularly in underserved communities, are supported with the three foundations of lifelong health: O Optimal nutrition and physical activity, O Safe, supportive environments, and O Stable and nurturing adult-child relationships.



Agenda Item #3 – CCISD - STOPit app (Topic Lead by Lisa Edgar)

- STOPit App October 14, 2021, CCISD Director of Behavioral Support Services, Rhonda Burnell, sent out a Parent/Guardian letter promoting CCISD new STOPit app/on-line crisis reporting tool for parents/students/and community members. This reporting tool is designed to deter and mitigate bullying, cyber abuse, and other inappropriate behaviors. It consists of an app and a back-end incident management system for school administrators.
 - Students have access to the **STOPit** mobile app which has two simple and powerful features:
 - *I.* **Report** may be used by students to report incidents to school contacts anonymously.
 - **2. Messenger** may be used to engage in anonymous, two-way communication with school contacts.
 - Both Report and Messenger empower students to stand up for themselves and for one another. It also gives parents the opportunity to submit reports. Students and parents have the power to help put an end to harmful and inappropriate behavior they see online through social media and other means.
 - Students can use <u>STOPit</u> to reach out for help if they or peers are facing
 a personal crisis or experiencing bullying, abuse, or are otherwise in need
 of assistance. Our goal with <u>STOPit</u> is to create safer, kinder school
 communities both online and off.
 - O Students and parents/guardians may download the app from the app store on their personal devices. Students may use any district-issued device to make reports by clicking on the <u>STOPit</u> logo. Parents may access the reporting tool by accessing the CCISD home page and clicking on "Parent Home" under the "Parents" tab or visiting the <u>STOPit Website</u> and selecting the appropriate campus.

Adolescent immunizations are scheduled to protect adolescents before they are exposed to serious, potentially life threatening diseases. The Unity Consortium has immunization action steps.
- **Professional Development:** o PAX Good Behavior Game Virtual Training the PAX Good Behavior Game is a school-based, classroom preventative intervention used by educators to teach self regulation. PAX Good Behavior Game is a set of strategies for teachers to use throughout their day to build students' behavioral skills and stamina for focused attention and on-task behavior. Research by Johns Hopkins University has shown that students who received PAX Good Behavior Game are more likely to experience success in school and have significantly improved lifetime outcomes.
