### PICK THREE

<p>Pick a character from your book, &amp; write a letter to your new teacher explaining who you are (pretend you're the character).</p>	<p>Take an AR test. Must score at least an 80 for this option to count.</p>	<p>Create a book trailer/commercial. (Lots of examples of these online). Email the trailer to your teacher.</p>
<p>Write a comic book strip that tells about your favorite part of the book. The comic strip should have a minimum of 6 scenes</p>	<p>Put together a 'care package' for the main character in your book. 'Pack' things that will help them either during the story or after. Write about each item, and explain why the item is included. (place items in a box or bag)</p>	<p>Write a book review. Would you recommend this book to anyone? Who would enjoy this type of book? What genre is the book?</p>
<p>Write a different ending to your story. Be as creative as you want to be. (write it by hand, type it, or create a Google doc)</p>	<p>Record yourself doing a two minute dramatic reading from the book. Email it to your new teacher.</p>	<p>Design a quiz on your book that you can use to test your classmates. Minimum of 10 questions. (write by hand, type it, or use an online quiz creator like quizizz.com)</p>
